21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 23, 2020

The main theme of all three readings is that God is the Source of all authority. God shares His authority with elected civil rulers to serve the people and with Church leaders for the material and spiritual welfare of His people.

The first reading, taken from Isaiah, tells us how God hates unfaithful and selfish officials. He removed the proud "master of the royal palace" from his office, taking from Shebna the power and responsibility of which he had proven unworthy, and gave both to the humble and faithful Fliakim

The Gospel passage of today shows us how Peter confesses Jesus as his Lord and Savior and how Jesus, in turn, approves Peter's profession of faith and gives him teaching and ruling authority in his Church. Thus, Jesus establishes a unifying authority in his Church to serve the spiritual and physical needs of the Church members. The authority Jesus gives to Peter is: authority based on faith, it must be exercise by faith in the Lord. Peter's role from then on ward became that of strengthening his brothers and sisters in faith.

Peter's faith becomes the foundation of all our belief in Jesus. It is to this Peter that Jesus entrusts the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven. Upon his solid, dedicated faith the Church will always rely, for unity and encouragement. He tended the early church by sharing his deep faith in Christ the Risen Lord. So, he kept them united in a community of mutual love, and in faithful obedience to the Gospel.

While he is appointed to "feed the lambs and sheep", to "confirm his brethren," and welcome the first pagan convert into the Church, Peter is not without flaws. Weakness of faith (when he began to sink), rash self-confidence and eventual denial that he knows Jesus, portray his human weaknesses and the power of the grace of God which sustains us even when we feel weak or in doubt.

Each of us must make a personal answer to Our Lord's question: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter's profession is a solid basis from which to begin. You are the "Son of the Living God." But to make this profession of faith, We need to accept and experience Jesus as our Lord and Savior. This means that we are accepting Jesus as our Good Shepherd, our Savior and Redeemer. Jesus should become a living experience for us – as our Lord who is protecting us and providing for us in our life's journey, loving us, forgiving us, helping us, and transforming our lives and outlook. This is made possible by our listening to Jesus through reading of the of the Bible and by talking to Jesus through daily, personal, communal and prayers. Our personal experience of Jesus will also lead us to praise and thank God in all the events of our lives, both good pleasant and painful, realizing that God's loving hands are behind everything. This experience of Jesus will lead us to rendering humble, loving service to others with the strong conviction that Jesus is present in every person.

Jesus remains at the center, as the Christ, Son of the Living God, and he continues to be the Church's true Rock. We today, just as much as in the time of St Peter, need the ministry of faithful apostles, entrusted by Christ to build up his people, witness to the faith, and provide leadership in Christian love. Pope, bishops, priests and other ministries exist in order to serve, to unity God's people and to bring them closer to Jesus. To carry out this noble vocation they need the support of each one of us, especially to pray for them, for their courage and perseverance.

NEW WORSHIP AREA

The last time we spoke about the project, we had just successfully appeared before the Diocesan Building and Renovation Commission (BARC) who complimented us for the plan and indicated

they would recommend approval at the same time. They asked us to accomplish four tasks; shorten the distance between Altar and the Tabernacle, provide a movable handicap ramp, provide running water in the Baptismal Font, and install a lock on the men's restroom handle. We have either submitted plans to accomplish these tasks or completed them. In the interim, and because of COVID-10, the Diocese has not issued any approval letters for new construction with no indication when that will change. We have temporary approval of our financial plan, which will require a loan of an undetermined amount to complete the construction. In summary, we now await an approval letter from the Diocese to begin.
