Today we celebrate the Conclusion of the Bicentennial Jubilee of Our Diocese, and the Mass will be in Honor of "The Blessed Virgin Mary Mother of the Church."

The Conclusion of Diocesan Bicentennial Celebrations Blessed Virgin Mary Mother of the Church January 17, 2021

Today we conclude the year long celebrations of The Bicentennial Jubilee of our Diocese. The celebrations were scaled down due to COVID-19 pandemic, nevertheless, this time has been a time of gratitude to the Lord who has blessed this Diocese for the last two hundred years with a strong faith, expressed in the many activities carried out in our Parishes throughout the Diocese.

Now as we look towards the future, we are encouraged with the foundations already built, to continue to be a strong Catholic Community which will spread the Good news of the Gospel to all corners of this vast Diocese and beyond.

Today we are invited by our Bishop to celebrate this conclusion of our Bicentennial Jubilee by honoring The Blessed Virgin Mary Mother of the Church. The title "Mother of the Church" (Mater Ecclesiae) was applied to the mother of Jesus by Pope Paul VI in November 1964 at the close of the Second Vatican Council. The title was first used in the 4th century by Saint Ambrose of Milan and more recently the title was favored by Pope John Paul II and then incorporated into the Catechism of the Catholic Church. In March 2018, Pope Francis inserted into the Roman Calendar the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, to be celebrated each year on the Monday after Pentecost.

It is because of Mary being at the heart of our Christian faith that she honored with this title of Mother of the Church. Yes, she is the mother of Jesus, but if you reflect, and be guided according to what we read in the scriptures, we see how she was involved in every event during the time of Jesus and after his death and resurrection.

She was there at his crucifixion, and her maternal role towards Christ's faithful is founded specifically on the words spoken by Jesus from the cross to the Beloved Disciple, who represents all future disciples, the church. We have read in the Gospel that: When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." Therefore, Jesus himself place her as the mother of the Church, represented here by the beloved disciple. In her role as Mother of the Church, Mary embraces each and every one in the Church, and embraces each and every one through the Church.

Again, we see Mary together with all the apostles and disciples praying in the upper room, awaiting the gift of the Holy Spirit. At Pentecost, Mary's maternal presence was right there at the birth of the Church, thus, we rightly honor her as mother of the Church. Brothers and sister, as we conclude our Bicentennial celebrations we look to the future with hope and we are resolved to carry out our mission of living the Christian way of life and spreading it to all

those whom we encounter. Mary our mother will go with us, sharing our joys and hopes, helping us in all the challenges of our daily life. She will always open her arms to us her sons and daughters with tender love, to give us comfort and guidance.

May Mary, the mother of the Church, accompany the Diocese of Richmond as we strive to pass on the Good News of Jesus her son to future generations.

LOOKING AHEAD

As the new worship area slowly becomes a reality, we eagerly await its completion and now face the tasks ahead in financing it.

When combined with Building Funds assets on hand, our pledge campaign was successful enough to gain Diocesan approval to move forward with the project and authorize a \$300K loan when needed to pay construction costs. Our goal this year, as construction continues, is to raise as much money as possible to pay for any cost overruns and reduce the final loan amount.

Our Fund-Raising Committee is engaged in planning fund raising events and will soon publish a list of items that may be purchased as a memorial by parishioners interested in doing so, but immediately we will begin a monthly special collection for the new worship area. Our parish has always responded to special need, and financing the construction of our new worship area is one of them

I would be remiss if I did not take a moment to thank you for your prayers, your messages of support, and your participation in Masses, whether in person or by livestreaming. It is meaningful to me and our parish. I also want to thank all of you who continue to support us financially. Your generosity truly knows no bounds. If your circumstances permit. I encourage all of you to seriously consider participating in all of our new worship area fund raising events this coming year.


SOME THOUGHTS

WHITTMAN SENDS LETTER TO USPS

I am writing to you to express my concern over the disruption of mail flow in Virginia's First Congressional District. Recently, I have heard from a number of constituents and local elected officials who have seen delays in mail services, particularly in the areas of the Middle Peninsula, Fredericksburg, Hanover, Williamsburg, and the Northern Neck and/or serviced by the United States Postal Service (USPS)

Sandston processing office. I have constituents who rely on the USPS to deliver their medications on time, as well as their business mail.

I would appreciate you addressing this matter for the constituents in my district and for the USPS to make the necessary changes to ensure this does not continue to occur. I look forward to continuing to work together to address these and other critical issues facing our nation.
