PRESENT NORMS AND GUIDELINES FOR CELEBRATION OF THE MASS

We have begun the process of returning to a pre-pandemic celebration of the Liturgy. We will continue to follow the established guidelines we have been using, which are enumerated below. The remainder will be introduced gradually.

1. Masks: *Fully Vaccinated*. Effective May 15, 2021, fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask in any setting.

Unvaccinated. From ages 5 and older must cover their mouth and nose with a mask when present for any Mass or liturgical celebration.

- 2. Hand sanitizer: All entering the Church are asked to use hand sanitizer placed at the entrance.
- 3. Music Ministry: Choir may resume.
- 4. Lord's Prayer and Sign of Peace: We are to continue the practice of refraining from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace (bow or verbal gesture is appropriate).
- 5. Distribution of the cup: The distribution of the cup remains suppressed for deacons and the lay faithful until further notice.
- 6. Ushers: resume their normal procedures/functions as it was pre-Covid-19 except for collections. We will continue to use the baskets placed in the entrance.
- 7. Bulletins: We will continue to distribute them electronically until further notice.

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time September 12, 2021

"Who do people say that I am .. But who do you say that I am?"

Today's Gospel explains the basis of our Faith as our acceptance of Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the Living God and our Lord and Savior. It also tells us that Christ Jesus suffered, died, and rose from the dead to become our Savior. Finally, it outlines the conditions of Christian discipleship, namely: Knowing Jesus in a personal encounter in our lives, bearing witness that Jesus is the Son of God sent to save the world, and being ready to make sacrifices for our face by denying oneself, taking up one's cross, and following Jesus.

The question of Jesus in today's Gospel is central to the points above which are the real foundations of our faith in Christ Jesus. The acknowledgement that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, the son Of God. The disciples have spent some time now with Jesus. The time has come to declare clearly: Who is this person they are following? What is it that they find in Jesus? What do they grasp of his life, his message and of his mission?

Jesus begin is questions by asking what other people say. 'Who do people say that I am?' He wants to know what they are saying about Him. In other words, He wants to know how the Apostles have been describing Him to them? What witness are you giving to them about me? This is question to all of us. People have to understand and come to know Jesus through us who are his disciples. So, how have you been describing and presenting Jesus to others? Do they understand who is Jesus by listening to me, by observing my action, my lifestyle?


After hearing all what they say and think who he is, now Jesus is more interested in his disciples' position: «But you, who do you say that I am?». It's not enough that among them are various opinions, some more and some less certain. What's fundamental is that they who have committed themselves to his cause recognize Him and what his mission is all about. If they don't, who will keep his message alive? What will happen to the Kingdom of God he is trying to build? It is very important that the disciples have a are clear knowledge of who they are following,

The question is vital for his disciples because the answer they give will radically affects them. It's not possible to follow Jesus in an unconscious and casual manner. They have to know him all the more deeply. Peter answers in the name of all of them: «You are the Christ».

What is asked of the disciples and Apostles of in this Gospel is asked of each one of us. We have to know who Jesus is. This needs a personal experience of Jesus. To confess that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, is not learned from books but from a personal encounter with Jesus. We need to follow him closely and work with him day by day, allowing him to be part of our life. We need to experience his love, his forgiving power, then share the same with others.

Jesus tells Peter and his disciples very clearly that his mission is of unconditional love for us and that all true love involves suffering, because love is more concerned with the other's happiness than with one's own. True discipleship is seen when we are faithful to God in times of suffering. Jesus led by example and his total love for each of us was shown by his suffering and death on the cross

So, who is Jesus for me personally? No matter what we like to think, Jesus reveals to us who God is, Love. So, he is challenging us to go deep to the roots of our faith by making this faith truly personal. Jesus reveals to us that if we are to accept him as our Lord, we must accept his way of suffering, whenever it comes in our life. Following him involves commitment and determination. To follow Jesus and to Confess that He is the Savior, the Christ, sometimes means to accept sacrifices. But we are not alone, we follow Him, who is the ultimate example of self-giving love.




