

PRESENT NORMS AND GUIDELINES FOR CELEBRATION OF THE MASS

We have begun the process of returning to a pre-pandemic celebration of the Liturgy. We will continue to follow the established guidelines we have been using, which are enumerated below. The remainder will be introduced gradually.

1. Masks: **Fully Vaccinated.** Effective May 15, 2021, fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask in any setting.  
**Unvaccinated.** From ages 5 and older must cover their mouth and nose with a mask when present for any Mass or liturgical celebration.
2. Hand sanitizer: All entering the Church are asked to use hand sanitizer placed at the entrance.
3. Music Ministry: Choir may resume.
4. Lord's Prayer and Sign of Peace: We are to continue the practice of refraining from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace (bow or verbal gesture is appropriate).
5. Distribution of the cup: The distribution of the cup remains suppressed for deacons and the lay faithful until further notice.
6. Ushers: resume their normal procedures/functions as it was pre-Covid-19 except for collections. We will continue to use the baskets placed in the entrance.
7. Bulletins: We will continue to distribute them electronically until further notice.



## 28<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

October 10, 2021

The central message for us today is that we must give priority to God in our lives, not to our possessions. Today's readings remind us that we do not possess anything so important in our life that we refuse to surrender to the Lord. These things often possess us, and we become the prisoners of our possessions when we give our "things" top priority in our lives. This indeed goes against the First Commandment, "You shall not have other gods beside me" which demands that we give absolute and unconditional priority to God. And, by possessions, here it does not mean only property or other riches one might own, but everything including our opinions, our attitudes towards others, our lifestyle, our behaviors. All these can become a priority to us and take away our willingness to follow God's will and commandments.

Today's Gospel account tells us of someone, a man (a young man) who goes to Jesus and asks: "Good teacher what must I do to inherit eternal life". Jesus, in his answer he reminds him the importance of the Ten Commandments in one's life and as something required in order to attain eternal life "You Know the commandments..." The young man's reply to Jesus is that "I have observed all these from my youth" Jesus knew that what he was saying was true, indeed he has observed the commandments in his life, but how? He kept the commandments as mere observance, just not to be in trouble with God. In fact, one can keep all the rules and laws of his country or state not because he loves them but because he doesn't want to be in trouble. In our faith, in following Jesus, this is not enough. Something more is required, and that is what Jesus in today's Gospel asks the young man to do.

Jesus looked deeply into this man and loved him. And because he loved him, he proposed to him something which is beyond knowing the commandments, which is beyond mere keeping of the commandments of God. Jesus asked him total surrender to God and putting his faith in action. Jesus tells the young man: "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me".

Jesus asked him to place all that he had and all that he was into God's care, into God's hands. Jesus invited him to let God be the one who govern and directs his life, Jesus wanted him to acknowledge that no matter what he owns, he depends on God. But the young man thought otherwise. He thought that what Jesus was asking was too much, too costly. Thus, when he heard the answer of Jesus "... his face fell and went away sad, for he had many possessions". He feared the risk involved in the invitation of Jesus, in other words, he could not allow putting himself totally under God.

Peter and other Apostles likewise had to face the same situation, but their response was different. Peter said to Jesus: "We have given up everything and followed you" he wanted to know from Jesus what are they going to get in return. Jesus responded that those who left everything to follow him and for the sake of the Gospel, will be repaid a hundred times over, but with Persecutions/sufferings, and inherit everlasting life as well. Peter and his fellow Apostles accepted the invitation of Jesus and they followed him to the end.

Today, through this Gospel, Jesus is challenging our faith, our way of being Christians. We all know that things of value come at a cost and things of high value come at a high cost. If our Faith in God, our faith in Jesus is of greater value than the risks we have to take in order to live accordingly are high. Jesus is not asking us to give up our belongings, our houses, ... Jesus is calling us to acknowledge that we belong to God and all that we have comes from him. He wants us to acknowledge that God is the Ruler who governs our life, he wants us to know that we depend on him. Our knowledge, possessions, even our life itself, are all from God, He is the giver of all. This is what Jesus demanded from the young man: to leave everything he has and follow him, in other words, full trust in him.
