

RECENT QUESTIONS

After our publication of information about the Sacristy, someone asked

- Q: What is the difference between a vestry and a sacristy?
- A: A sacristy is a room in a church where sacred vessels, books, vestments, and other items are kept; it is some times also used by clergy to prepare for worship or meetings; a vestry is a room in a church where the clergy put on their vestments and store them; it is also used for meetings and classes.
- Monthly, I see a financial report that indicates a payment for diocesan assessments what are they?
- The assessments are namely four, of which we will expand upon in future bulletins:
- 1. A cathedraticum assessment for offertory & other receipts
- 2. A parish sharing assessment for tuition assistance to needy children attending Catholic Schools
- 3. An assessment for the Catholic Virginian costs
- 4. Property and Liability insurance.

THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

On this Sunday, the Second Sunday of Easter, is also the feast of Divine Mercy. The readings for this Sunday are about God's mercy which is revealed first and foremost, in sending of His only begotten Son to become our Savior and Lord through His suffering, death, and Resurrection.

The Gospel of today tells us that: On the evening of the first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them: "Peace be with you". This is not a greeting nor even a simple good wish: it is a gift, indeed, *the* precious gift that Christ offered his disciples after rising from the dead. It was to encourage them, to make them feel that He is alive and with them, they need not to fear. This peace is the fruit of the victory of God's love over evil, it is the fruit of forgiveness. Because true peace, that profound peace, comes from experiencing God's mercy. When we experience a merciful God who forgives us our faults and he is ready to welcome us back, as Jesus did to his Disciples who left him and even denied him, then we can feel real peace.

As well as his peace Jesus gave the Apostles the Holy Spirit so that they could spread "forgiveness" in the world, that forgiveness which only God can give and which came at the price of the Blood of Jesus. The Church is sent by the Risen Christ to pass on to men and women the forgiveness of sins and thereby make the Kingdom of God grow, to sow peace in hearts people so that they may also be strengthened in their relationships with God and with one another, in every society.

And as the gift of peace from the Risen Christ drove out fear from the Apostles and impelled them to leave and go out in public to spread the Gospel. Let us too have greater courage in witnessing to our faith in the Risen Christ! We must not be afraid of being Christian and living as Christians! We must have this courage to go and proclaim the Risen Christ, for he is our peace, he is our forgiveness, and he is our strength.

We can all find ourselves in the situation of those first disciples, locked in a hiding place. Because, any combination of mis-fortune, and fear, can water down our commitment to following the Lord. Like the disciples in today's gospel, we can be tempted to give up on our faith journey. The will to self-preservation can prevent us from doing what we are capable of doing with the Lord's help. The wounds we carry from earlier failed initiatives make us hesitate to try again. We hold back and stay safe.

The gospel reading today suggests a way out of our self-imposed fear. The Lord will find another way to enter our lives and to fill us with new life and energy for his service. No locked doors, nor even locked hearts, can keep him out. He finds a way to enter the space where we have chosen to retreat, and he empowers us to resist what is holding us back. He does require some openness on our part; at the least some desire on our part to become what he is calling us to be. The risen Lord never ceases to recreate us and to renew us in his love.


Just as Thomas was unmoved by the witness of the disciples who told him they had seen the Lord. Insisting that: "Unless I see the mark of nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." As he had done with the other disciples, the Lord takes Thomas on his own terms. He accommodates himself to Thomas' conditions and says, "Put your finger here."

The gospel today implies that the Lord meets us wherever we are. He takes us seriously in all our fears and doubts. The Lord is prepared to stand with us on our own ground, whatever that ground is, and from there he

will speak to us a word suited to our personal state of mind and heart. We don't have to get ourselves to some particular place in order for the Lord to engage with us. He takes himself to where we are, wherever it is a place of fear or of doubt. We pray during this Easter season for the openness to receive the Lord's coming into the concrete circumstances of our own



lives, so that we too might say with Thomas, "My Very Reverend Gerry Kaggwa Lord and my God."

Reading I: Acts 5:12–16 (signs and wonders)


Reading II: Revelation 1:9–11a, 12–13, 17–19 (first vision)
