The Fourth Sunday of Easter May 8, 2022

The fourth Sunday of Easter, known as Good Shepherd Sunday, is also the "World Day of Prayer for Vocations." Each year on this Sunday, we reflect on the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd who devotedly and kindly takes care of his flock. A shepherd leads, feeds, nurtures, comforts, corrects, and protects his flock. Responsibilities that belong to all Church leaders, parents, civil leaders, and all who are in charge of others. So, we pray today that we may become good shepherds to one another in whatever role God has called us to in the society.

Today's first reading describes how Paul and Barnabas opted to listen to the voice of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and follow him, and how, like their Master, they were rebuffed and rejected when they tried to share the good news of salvation. The second reading, taken from the book of Revelation, depicts Jesus as both the glorified Lamb and the Shepherd. John's vision encourages his readers with the assurance that every person who has ever followed Christ and led others to him will share everlasting life with him. The Gospel text offers us both comfort and a great challenge. The comforting message is that no one can snatch the sheep out of his Father's hands. The challenge is that we have to be good sheep.

We are invited today to become good shepherds and good sheep, good leaders, and good followers. Everyone who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. Hence pastors, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials, etc. are all shepherds. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time and talents for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers.

This Sunday is also called Vocations Sunday. And we are called upon today to pray in a special way for Vocations in the Church. The Church needs leaders who can take care of the needs of her members, especially Spiritual needs. So let us ask God to inspire by His Spirit, especially, the Young, to considered serving the Church in Priesthood, Religious life, Deaconate and in any other Ministry within the Church.

Besides the vocation to be a priest, a religious person (Nun or Brother) or a Permanent deacon, there are many other ways (vocations) in which one can serve the Church. The Lord has a life-vocation for each one of us. Each person can do something for the Lord and for the community that only he or she can do. Each one of us has a unique contribution to make to the work of the Lord in the world, to the life of the church, and that

contribution is just as important as anyone else's contribution. We each have a unique vocation and each vocation is equally significant.

Let us also pray for those already serving the Church to be Good shepherds of God's people through their actions but above all by their way
