## LEGACY GIFTS

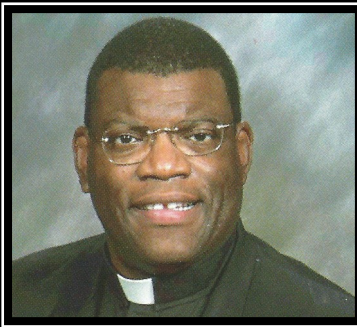
Members of our church gather each week around the

#### ASSESSMENTS



Perhaps you noticed in the brief financial report that one of our principal checks this week was for Diocesan assessments.

These are four in nature; Cathedraticum, Catholic Virginian, Parish Sharing, and Property and Liability Insurance.

The largest one is the Cathedraticum, which in general assesses all offertory collections and certain designated ones such as collections for flowers, Faith Formation, Parish Beautification, and Fundraising Revenue. However, the bulk of our special collections such as Parish Pence, Uganda, and national causes like Respect for Life are exempt from taxation.

The Diocese employs a sliding scale of percentages based on income which averages about 7% of our total taxable receipts. In successive weeks, we will explain the other assessments. If you have any questions about the Cathedraticum, just contact the office or Ray.

#### THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI- THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD



On the second Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi, which is Latin for "the body of Christ".

This feast day commemorates the Eucharist, the meal in which we partake of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharist is at the heart of our Catholic faith and traditionally, holds a special place among the sacraments.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church has this to say about the importance of the Eucharist:

1324 The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life.

"134 "The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it.

For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch."135

The Eucharist was instituted by Jesus at the Last Supper and this institution of the sacrament is celebrated on Holy Thursday.

However, the emphasis of the Triduum is on the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus, which creates the need for another feast day focusing on the Eucharist itself.

As Catholics, we believe in transubstantiation, the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist. This is what makes us "different" -Catholic.

#### A FATHER'S DAY PRAYER

Bless those fathers, who have taken it upon themselves the responsibility of parenting.

Bless those fathers, who have lost a spouse to death... or divorce, who are parenting their children alone.

Bless those fathers, who when the money runs low and when we need things; they provide.

Bless those fathers, who love unconditionally when they think they can't and they do.

Bless our fathers and give them grace and patience to handle situations in a loving way.

Bless our fathers by strengthening them with Your love that they may become the loving, caring fathers they are meant to be.

Bless our fathers by guiding them to be good role models and love all Your children.

Bless our fathers who choose to be brave and serve in the military. Thank you to the fathers who protect us, when we are scared and frightened.

Bless our fathers that with Your help, will be a father like You.

God, grant that we, their sons and daughters, will always honor them, love them and respect them.

God, heavenly father, bless all the fathers in the world. We ask you to grant this through Christ Our Lord and the Holy Spirit.

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord  
'Corpus Christi' June 19, 2022

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, or as it is traditionally called, "Corpus Christi". This solemnity differs from Holy Thursday when we celebrate the initiation of the sacrament of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Today in gratitude, we celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the ever presence of Christ in the life of the Church.

Today we are invited to celebrate what we believe in, that Jesus Christ is really and truly present in the Eucharist, uniting us to his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, and nourishing us throughout our life as his followers. Unlike many other Christian Churches, we do not believe that the Eucharist just points to the Lord or signifies our union with Christ. We Catholics believe that the Eucharist is the Lord. We believe that when we receive Communion, we receive Jesus within us, sanctifying us. We speak to the Lord within us. When the bread and wine are consecrated during the Mass, the very substance or essence of the bread and wine is changed from the physical to the spiritual, the body and blood of the Lord.

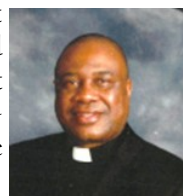
We call this the Real Presence. That is why we say that the hosts and the wine are consecrated, not just blessed. That is also why the hosts which are consecrated during the Mass are reserved in our tabernacles after Mass. We can then take the Real Presence of the Lord to the sick and dying. We also can worship before the Eucharistic presence of the Lord here in Church. The Eucharist is the meal of the believing community, but it is far more than just a meal of fellowship. The Celebration of the Eucharist is not a social gathering. Each person who receives communion, receives the Body of Christ within him or her as individuals. In this way each person is united together to the total Mystical Body of Christ.

Our union is far more than fellowship. Perhaps the best example is the example of the vine and the branches. The branches of a vine or a tree do not just live in fellowship with each other, they live united to each other through their union to the life-giving trunk. We are the branches united to the vine and sustained by the life force of the Eucharist. For those who believe, the reception of the Eucharist is an affirmation of the entire faith of the Church. People may share a belief in Christ, and even celebrate a communion service, but not necessarily share a belief in the Eucharist as being the real presence of Christ. A person needs to have this faith before the person can join the Eucharistic meal.

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord is a good time for a bit of a refresher regarding proper reverence in the church and when receiving communion. Because we believe that Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament within our tabernacles, we need to show reverence in Church. When we enter a pew, we need to genuflect, bend the right knee. If we have bad knees and cannot genuflect, we should bow. Once in our place, we should say a prayer of greeting to the Lord.

The most important practice we must have, is to know that at communion, we are united in a special way with Jesus. We need to speak to the Lord within us. We need to pray directly to Jesus inside of us in the Eucharist. It is so wrong and so disrespectful to the Presence of the Lord for us to receive communion and then ignore the One within us.

We have been entrusted with the Body of Christ. We must care for this gift properly. The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord leads us to reflect on the depth of this great gift. The celebration reminds us that when we receive communion, we do not just perform a symbolic action, we receive Jesus Christ. May we do so with reverence.
