LEGACY GIFTS

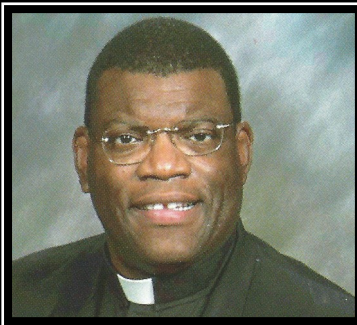

ASSESSMENTS (part 2)

Continuing with our discussion of assessments, we previously covered the largest, the Cathedralicum, and what parish income is assessed at an average of 7%. The Catholic Virginian is published bi-weekly, and parishes pay for its publication and mailing costs. The amount of taxable income used to calculate the cathedralicum is the same figure used for the Catholic Virginian Assessment. It is not based on the number of parishioners receiving the newspaper, but rather 1.35% of parish taxable income. For further information nor clarification, please contact the office or Ray.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Question: Now that we have pews and kneelers, and not having knelt for more than a decade in our old worship area, when should I be kneeling during Mass?

Answer: For Roman Catholics, kneeling is one of the most distinctive physical gestures of prayer during the celebration of Mass. In fact, for many centuries the lay faithful of the Roman Rite would kneel for almost the entire duration of Mass.

Catholics kneel because Jesus knelt during prayer. Additionally, kneeling is typically seen in the Gospels as a way to express supplication and adoration.

For these reasons the Roman Rite instructs the faithful to kneel during Mass specifically when Jesus is made present on the altar. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, "In the Diocese of the United States of America, (the faithful) should kneel beginning after the singing or recitation of the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer."

This physical posture is meant to express a spiritual attitude of adoration before the triune God, truly and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. It is an act of humility, recognizing our own littleness before the creator of the world. That act of kneeling prepares our hearts to receive God within our souls, striking down our pride with a physical reminder of what our soul should be like spiritually.

While not officially part of the Rite, it is a common custom in some churches to maintain a kneeling posture until the consecrated hosts are placed back within the tabernacle.

All this being said, If your physical condition and/or age precludes you from kneeling when it is prescribed, act in a way that is conformable for you.

The instruction manual is located on the bottom right corner of the bulletin.

Today's readings are about God's call and one's commitment in answer to that call. They ask for total commitment made in total freedom with the spirit of patient love, that is, to say an unconditional "Yes" to Jesus and to the Christian way of life, as a true disciple of Christ.

The first reading describes how Elisha committed himself wholeheartedly to answer God's call to be a prophet, in spite of his initial hesitation, when God called him through the prophet Elijah. The second reading, taken from Paul's letter to the Galatians, reinforces the commitment message of the first reading. Paul warns that true freedom is not meant to be a license for self-indulgence, but to be a way to show God, ourselves, and other human beings our commitment to God and to His service.

The first part of today's Gospel records Jesus' teaching on Christian tolerance, given after he had observed an angry response of two of his apostles, James, and John, who were angry at the Samaritans who had refused to receive Jesus as a prophet and allow him to travel through their village because Jesus was travelling to Jerusalem. They asked Jesus if he wanted them to bring down fire from Heaven to destroy them.

In the second part of today's Gospel, Luke introduces three potential disciples who offered lame reasons that made Jesus' call to ministry "impossible" for them to accept, after Jesus had told them plainly what the commitment required, and the cost involved. He told them that he journey would be vigorous. "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." He is saying that this journey will not be easy. They were found unfit and unprepared to follow Jesus as his disciples. We too, are asked to follow Jesus, totally and immediately, without any reservations, both by giving priority to him and to his cause and by surrendering our lives to God in humble and dedicated service to others.

Because, once we meet Christ, only one thing is and must be important for us: to accomplish the mission which he confided in us. Yes, he who meets Christ in his life, forgets what lies behind and looks forward to what lies ahead in building the Kingdom of God. Surely, only the future must count for us! What we are going to do for Christ, what we accomplish today to proclaim the Kingdom of God in all aspects of our life, this is what is important, this is what gives our life on earth all its meaning.

Jesus is inviting us to follow him without excuses, we have to be resolute like Him, our Lord and Leader. We are told that Jesus 'resolutely took the road to Jerusalem'. Jerusalem is the place where Jesus' journey will meet its goal and completion: his Passion, Resurrection and Ascension. Going up to Jerusalem with determination and commitment expresses the free decision of Jesus to surrender faithfully to the will of the Father and never to give up despite the cost. As Christians, each of us who claims to be a disciple of Jesus has to journey to his/her own Jerusalem. It is a journey to be faithful to whatever commitment we have made in life - be it marriage, priesthood, the religious life, or any other vocation and state of life one chooses. Each of us will meet certain obstacles along the way, certain temptations to face, but never give up, never be discouraged.

Jesus has a dream for each one of us. He sees our capacity to accept the cost of discipleship, our ability to be faithful despite our occasional failures. He will be with us every step of the way. He knows how hard it is since he has gone the way before us.
