

PENECOST SUNDAY

The Christian holy feast day of Pentecost, which is celebrated 50 days after Easter commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described



in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31). In Christian tradition, this event represents the birth of the early Church.

This fullness of the Spirit was not to remain uniquely the Messiah's, but was to be communicated to all the people. On several Occasions, Christ promised this outpouring of the Spirit, a promise which he fulfilled first on Easter Sunday and them more strikingly at Pentecost.

This Solemnity makes us remember and relive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and the other disciples gathered in prayer with the Virgin Mary in the Upper Room (Acts 2:1-11). Jesus, risen and ascended into Heaven, sent his Spirit to the Church so that every Christian might participate in his own divine life and become his valid witness in the world. The Holy Spirit breaking into history, defeats aridity, opens hearts to hope, stimulates and foster in us an interior maturity in our relationship with God and with our neighbor.

The color red is synonymous with the celebration of Pentecost Sunday.

Pentecost Sunday

June 5, 2022

Pentecost literally means 50th. It is a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover feast by the Jews and a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus by Christians. The Jewish Pentecost was originally a post-harvest thanksgiving feast. Later, the Jews included in it the remembrance of God's Covenants with Noah after the Deluge and with Moses at Mt. Sinai. For Christians, it a day on which we celebrate and remember the great event which took place in Jerusalem when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles locked up in one room. After receiving the Holy Spirit, the Apostles were filled with courage and begun to proclaim the Good News of the Risen Christ without fear.

So, on the day of Pentecost:

- I) The Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles.
- 2) The frightened apostles were transformed into fiery preachers and evangelizers and were given the gift of tongues by a special anointing of the Holy Spirit.
- 3) The listeners experienced a fresh anointing of the Holy Spirit through the apostles' gift of tongues: they heard Peter speaking in their native languages.
- 4) The early Christians became powerful witnesses of their Faith in Jesus.


The role of the Holy Spirit in our Christian life: The Holy Spirit makes us the Living Temples of God. He strengthens us in our fight against temptations and in our mission of bearing witness to Christ by our transparent Christian lives. He teaches and constantly reminds all the teaching of Jesus and of the Church. He gives us His gifts which enriches the Church


The Holy Spirit sanctifies us through the various Sacraments of the Church. Through Baptism He makes us children of God and heirs of Heaven. Through Confirmation, He makes us temples of God, warriors of the Gospel, and defenders of the Faith. Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, He enables us to be reconciled with God by pardoning our sins. Through the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, He gives us spiritual nourishment by changing bread and wine into Jesus' Body, Blood through Epiclesis. And, through the Sacraments of the priesthood (Ordination) and matrimony (Marriage), He makes the Church community holy and fruitful.

As Christians, we need to permit the Holy Spirit to take control of our lives by constantly remembering His holy presence and by asking His daily assistance to listening to the voice of God and to carry out in our lives His will.

The Holy Spirit who transformed the Apostles, he is the one who transforms the Church today. Because when the Holy Spirit came upon the Eleven and Mary that Pentecost Sunday, through them He came upon all who would choose Jesus Christ. There was a tremendous power evidenced on that day. The Holy Spirit was the Power. The Holy Spirit was God Himself transforming people into the Body of Christ.

The apostles began the mission of evangelization, of bringing the world to the Gospel by invoking the Holy Spirit, the Power of God. We also can invoke the Holy Spirit, the Power of God. We can do this by virtue of our Baptism and Confirmation, our personal sharing in Pentecost. We can call upon God to be present. And He will be present. Very Reverend Gerry Kaggw




