- *Perhaps we can be more inclusive and draw more people back by explaining and educating parishioners on the Church's teaching on the Sacrament of Communion.

Our guest priest during Father's absence will be Reverend Christopher Isinta, a retired priest of the Archdiocese of Newark, who will reside in the rectory while here. His availability will allow us to celebrate Daily Mass during August on a normal schedule.



17th Sunday in Ordinary Time © July 24, 2022

The main theme of today's Scripture readings is the power of intercessory prayer, and the necessity for persistence and perseverance in prayer with trusting faith and boldness. These readings teach us what to pray for, and how to pray. The first reading, taken from the book of Genesis, gives us the model for intercessory prayer provided by Abraham in his dialogue with God. Through his skillful bargaining and humble, persistent intercession, God is actually being moved to mercy by the goodness of a few innocents in the city.

In the Gospel today Jesus teaches his disciples to pray the "Our Father." One of the prayers that has special significance for us is the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father, because it was taught to us by Jesus. You will notice that we listened to the Lord's Prayer today in Luke's Gospel, which is slightly different to the version we use. Church uses the one in Matthew which is slightly longer than Luke's version. In this prayer, we see Jesus teaching us to pray for what we need. He also, encourages us to prayer unceasingly. We have to persist in our praying. In other words, keep praying to God for what you need, do not stop praying, continue to pray until your prayers are answered. Our Father is the foundation of all prayers. It involves all that we pray for.

Our Father: Jesus taught us to call God Father because he is the source of all life. To call God 'Our Father' shows the intimacy that should exist between us and our heavenly Father. We call God OUR Father because we are all one family in the Church. Civil society makes distinctions and differences, but it is not so in the Church. Since baptism we all belong to the one family of God.

Hallowed be your Name: In this petition we ask that God's name be recognized as hallowed and holy all over the world. Too often there is a lack of respect for the holiness of God's name and in this prayer, we pray that the whole world may respect God's name.

Your Kingdom Come: Jesus preached many times about the Kingdom of God using parables. When praying for the coming of the God's Kingdom, we pray that our world will more and more come to reflect the goodness and love of God.

Thy Will be done on earth as it is in heaven: This petition is only in Matthew's version of the prayer (not in Luke's). We pray in that God's plan may be fulfilled in our lives and in the life of every person in the whole world. When God's will is done in our lives, then we become most fully who we are meant to be.

Give us each day our daily bread: we ask God to provide us with all that we need e.g., food, house, etc... Although we work to provide for our needs, we know that ultimately everything we have is a gift from God. We also ask God to fulfill our spiritual needs.

Forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us: We all stand in need of God's mercy and there is no limit to God's mercy. We can always reach out to God for his mercy. We are also reminded to forgive those who hurt us because we ask God to forgive us just as we forgive others. Forgiveness is not just an emotion; it is a decision. We need to decide to forgive those who hurt us.

And do not subject us to the final test/lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil: Obviously God does not want us to fall into temptation or to be overcome by evil. Here we ask God to prevent us from falling into temptation, but if it happens due to human weakness, then to rescue us.

Through the Our Father, Jesus is giving us a new vision of human relationships: that we all, irrespective of our social background, are the

children of God and thereby are brothers and sisters. When we are able to treat God as our Father and love Him accordingly, and if we are able to treat every other human being as our own dear brothers and sisters and love them accordingly, then shall we experience the Kingdom of God here on earth and enjoy this in the next life. When we love each other and forgive each other's failings God also will love us and forgive us. This is the foundation of true faith.
