Charitable Remainder Trusts allow you to make a gift to your church while retaining income from the gifted asset during your lifetime (and that of your spouse). If the trust is funded with appreciated property, capital gains taxes may be avoided. There will also be a significant current income tax deduction at the time the trust is created.




Two Sundays ago, we said goodbye to Carol Smith. who left Middlesex to be closer to family. Carol and spouse Art, joined the parish in

On the 21st, Deacon Jim Satterwhite will be the Celebrant, and Deacon Jim Badalis will round out the month on the 28th. Because of this change we will not have Daily Mass during August.

#### The 18<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 'C' July 31, 2022

The Message of today's readings is the futility of the greed and thirst for power because everything and everyone is "here today and gone tomorrow." So, the meaning of life cannot be found in selfishly seeking possessions and power, but only in God.

Today we focus on our priorities and attitudes in life. Nowhere in today's readings or in the Bible does it say that having possessions is wrong. The question is what importance do we give them in our lives? The first reading today is from the Book of Ecclesiastes. In this reading we hear that 'all things are vanity', meaning that many things we take to be important are but an illusion. They are not important after all. It is an illusion to think that wealth or possessions or power in themselves can give true happiness and especially if we put them in the place of God so that they become idols. Because we then act as if we are independent of God

In the gospel Jesus refuses to get involved in a dispute regarding an inheritance between two brothers. He takes the opportunity to warn people against avarice or greed of any kind. Greed can become an idol because it consists in putting our trust in something other than God. Jesus is not talking only about material possessions. He is talking about anything that can become an idol for us. Anything which can take us away from love of God and neighbor.

The parable itself offers two points worthy of consideration. The first point is the rich man's self-centeredness. The wealth resulting from his abundant harvest will be enjoyed by him alone. An abundant harvest would most likely require a larger work force, but the idea of sharing with the laborers the benefits of the bumper crop never crossed the rich man's mind.

We may not be rich farmers ourselves, but we have all been blessed with a variety of gifts, an abundance of richness. We need to be willing to share with others the gifts God gave us. We are invited to share our blessings with others. The parable of the rich farmer gives us a warning as well as an invitation. It reminds us that our God given gifts, be it material things or talents, are merely lent to us by God, and that we are accountable for their use. We must be generous in sharing our time, our treasure, and our talents in Christian stewardship.

The lesson we get from today's readings is that we are here on earth only for a short time and that we should think of the above (heaven) not of what is on earth as St. Paul says in the second reading. The real riches that we take with us to heaven are those kind gestures towards the needy. These acts of love will give one real freedom and a deep sense of peace and joy.

The goal of life is to be eternally happy, not temporarily happy. Without God all life is meaningless. But with God, every aspect of our lives proclaims the reason for our creation: to know him, to love him, to serve him by rendering service to our neighbor and our community. This is true happiness, which lasts forever.


