Our celebrant today is *Deacon Jim Satterwhite* Deacon Jim Badalis will round out the month on the 28th. Because of this change we will not have Daily Mass during August.

Today's celebration is termed "Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest" (SCAP) We have celebrated in this manner in the past but not recently. Some of the normal Mass procedures are suspended during SCAP

and others are changed.

So as not to confuse anyone, here is a summary of noticeable changes and/or things that will occur as normal: *Communion will be distributed for the faithful with previously consecrated hosts.

- *There will be no entry or exit processions.
- *No hymns will be sung but instruments may be played during these times.
- *Liturgy of the word and prayers of the faithful will be as normal. *We will sing a communion hymn and mediation song.
- *The Gloria will be sung following the distribution of Holy Communion.
- *The collections and announcements will occur following the Gloria.
- *The sign of peace will occur after the final blessing.
- *We trust you will adapt easily to these revised procedures which will be used next Sunday as well.

Since SCAP is relatively new to our church, here is some additional information about it.

WHO?

- Who authorizes the use of Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest? Only the bishop has authority to approve and regulate the use of SCAP.
- integrity of the celebration, except in case of emergency where someone else may be appointed.
- Who may preside over the celebration? A deacon presides over such celebrations whenever possible.
- this role.

WHEN?

- When is it permissible to hold a Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest? Death or illness of the priest
- Death or emergency in the priest's family
- Unsuccessful attempts to find a replacement during serious commitments elsewhere Other emergency conditions according to pastoral need When weather conditions make it impossible for the priest to be present

GUEST PRIEST

TODAY'S CELEBRATION SCAP

With a decline in the number of priests and/or extraordinary situations may arise where "in the judgment of the diocesan bishop, it is not practical or possible for the community to participate in the celebration of Mass in a church nearby" (SCAP n. 14). In these situations, pastors may obtain permission from the bishop for a "Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest," which

If a pastor foresees a need for the use of SCAP, he may petition the bishop for permission. The pastor is responsible to ensure the

When no deacon is available, "upon the request and recommendation by the pastor, the bishop may appoint lay persons, who may be religious, as lay leaders of prayer, who are entrusted with the care of preparing and directing these celebrations" (SCAP n. 26). These lay leaders of prayer will be appointed by the bishop for a term of five years, and receive proper training to fulfill


