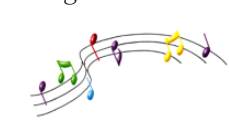

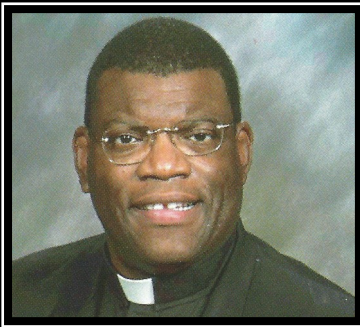
OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

PARISH COUNCIL NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

This Sunday we will be collecting nomination forms for the annual parish council election. Forms may be dropped into the collection basket, handed to an usher, or delivered to the church office. You are welcome to email your nominations to the church office before Sunday or up to Wednesday morning, September 28.

Please prayerfully consider whether you or someone you know should be nominated to serve on our parish council. There are nine elected members on our parish council who, together with the various ministry committee chairs, meet every other month for prayer and to develop recommendations for the pastor. Next month, on Sunday, October 16, we will elect three parishioners to serve a three year term on the council.

Spike Nunn, Kathy Kauffman and John Weidner will be completing their three year terms at the end of this year. Since Spike and Kathy have both served two consecutive terms, they are not eligible to stand for re-election. We were blessed to have their voices on the council for many years!

Nominations will be published in the October 2 bulletin and we will announce the nominees at Mass on October 9, which is Social Sunday and should offer a good opportunity for parishioners to meet this year's nominees.

We plan to collect ballots at Mass on Sunday, October 16 and will accept ballots at the church office beginning Tuesday, October 11 through Wednesday, October 19. As with nominations, you are welcome to email your vote to the church office.

Today's first reading from prophet Amos warns us not to be too much satisfied with ourselves about our place in the society – especially if we forget to notice other people around us. He describes people living in luxury, eating, and drinking the best of everything, thinking only of themselves. Amos concludes, "They shall be the first to go into exile."

This reading ties in so well with Luke's Gospel of the Rich Man and Lazarus. In this parable, Jesus tells of a nameless Rich Man who lived a life of excess. He didn't just eat well, he "dined sumptuously each day." Yet literally at his doorstep was Lazarus, a starving man who longed for the scraps that fell from the Rich Man's table. But as the Rich Man walked past him every day coming and going to his house, it never occurred to him to help the fellow human being lying begging in front of him.

One thing to notice here in this parable is that the rich man has no name. He is a representative of all of us in one way or another. You see, sometimes we fail to recognize others, especially those in need, their needs are not important to us, or we just doubt/question if really, they are in need. (Needs here, don't mean only money, material things)

We are told from the Gospel that: from hell the rich man lifted up his eyes and saw Lazarus. His eyes had never met Lazarus' eyes before. Yes, the Rich Man may have noticed Lazarus in stinky, dirty clothes begging for food. He may even have complained about the beggar who was a living eyesore at his gate. He never saw Lazarus as a human being like him, who had a right to be treated with dignity, but he noticed a beggar, a disturbance to his peace. The first time that the Rich Man really saw Lazarus as a person, not as an eyesore, was when it was too late. It was from hell.

Perhaps we have walked down a street and come upon someone calling out for food or help. What are we inclined to do? Are we inclined to pretend that we do not see them? Do our eyes glance elsewhere, so we don't meet their eyes? Or perhaps we make immediate judgments. We glance at someone and decide that this may be a drug addict, or an alcoholic, perhaps a thief, lazy... not to mention an illegal immigrant who is just bringing us problems. And so, we walk by the 'Lazaruses' of today in our society without noticing them as human being like us, who need our help.

The parable also warns us to be concerned about being isolated. We have to be careful not to let our way of life or way of thinking, our opinions isolate us from the human community. It is easy for us to form the mentality that what is important is my happiness. What goes on in other people's lives especially those in need, is none of our business. We create a separation between us and them (the needy, the poor of the world, of our society) The Rich man created this separation, isolating himself from Lazarus. He did not recognize him as a human being worthy of his attention. He could not bridge the gap that connected him to Lazarus as a brother. And this isolation, this separation, followed him even after death.

Today's readings invite us to look at the chasms we create in our own lives, the false boundaries between Us and Them. Sometimes, we fail to reach out to those who need us because of our own protectiveness, because of fear. So today, look around and see if there are people in your life you failed to pay attention to. Those you failed to recognize as human beings like yourself.
