But what will we hand down to those who follow? How will we be remembered? Will we leave more than an empty spot in a pew?



Labor Day 2022 will occur on Monday, September 5th. Labor Day pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers and is traditionally observed on the first Monday in September. It was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. Labor Day weekend also symbolizes the end of summer and the start of back to school for many Americans. It is celebrated with parties, street parades, barbecues, firework displays, athletic events and other public gatherings.

Why do we celebrate Labor Day? Labor Day, an annual celebration of workers and their achievements, originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters.

As manufacturing increasingly supplanted agriculture as the wellspring of American employment, labor unions, which had first appeared in the late 18th century, grew more prominent and vocal. They began organizing strikes and rallies to protest poor conditions and compel employers to renegotiate hours and pay.

The idea of a "workingmen's holiday," celebrated on the first Monday in September, caught on in many industrial centers across the country, and many states passed legislation recognizing it. Congress would not legalize the holiday until 12 years later.

Congress passed an act making Labor Day a legal holiday in the District of Columbia and the territories. On June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed it into law. More than a century later, the true founder of Labor Day has yet to be identified.

Many credit Peter J. McGuire, cofounder of the American Federation of Labor, while others have suggested that Matthew Maguire, a secretary of the Central Labor Union, first proposed the holiday.


We regret to announce the death of Karin
