## OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

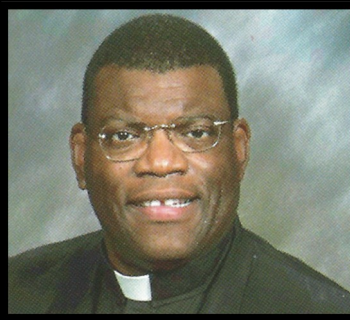
The youth faith formation classes will be learning about charity and giving

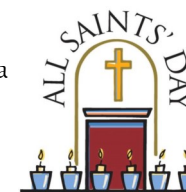

#### BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH



For nearly four decades now, the country has recognized October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. It is a time annually devoted to educating everyone about breast cancer-including metastatic breast cancer (MBC)-and the importance of early detection and access to timely, high-quality care. It rose to popularity, and each year more and more attention was presented on this issue. Pink is the color that represents supporting National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Wear pink!

#### ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS DAY



Next Tuesday, November 1st, is all Saints Day, a holy day of obligation, and we will celebrate Mass here at COV at 9am, with a 6:30pm Mass at FdS. The next day, on Wednesday, November 2nd, we will celebrate Mass at 11am in the cemetery, weather permitting. As has been our practice in the past during November, we honor our relatives who have passed away. In the Narthex is a receptacle for memorial pictures of your loved ones. Beginning this Sunday you may bring your pictures which will be placed on a Memorial table. At that time, you can also fill a purple slip of paper with the names of the individuals you want remembered and place them in the decorative basket which will be placed on the Altar for all Masses in November.

A saint is someone who is in heaven-it is as simple as that. While "saint" as a title is reserved to those whose lives the Church has thoroughly investigated (typically through whose intercession two miracles can be demonstrated to have occurred), the term applies to anyone in Heaven.

Everyone from your saintly grandmother to the martyrs facing death for Christ: They are all part of the communion of saints. The Church commemorates all these saints on All Saints' Day.

All Saint' Day is recognized as one of the most important feasts on the liturgical calendar. However, the celebration of Halloween typically overshadows the commemoration of All Saints 'Day.

Most of us realize that Halloween is in reality the vigil of All Saints' ("Allhallows Eve" or "Hallow E'en"), but All Saints' Day itself has become a bit of an afterthought.

It shouldn't be this way! The saints are our friends, our intercessors, our brothers and sisters in Christ. They care deeply for us, and their lives are recognized by the Church as exemplary, as models to follow.

All Soul' Day commemorates the faithful departed. In Western Christianity, this day is observed principally in the Catholic Church, although some churches of the Anglican Communion and the Old Catholic Churches also celebrate it. The Eastern Orthodox churches observe several All Soul's Days during the year. The Roman Catholic celebration is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful who at death have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and by the sacrifice of the Mass. In other words, when they died, they had not yet attained full sanctification and moral perfection, a requirement for entrance into Heaven. This is the reason why All Souls' Day is on 2 November after All Saints' Day, 1 November, which commemorates the departed who have attained the beatific vision, the Saints.



The first reading focuses on the love God has for all he has created. It reminds us that God's Almighty Power is found in His strength to be merciful. That is why God, who created the universe, does not condemn, or abandon it, but waits for sinners to repent. God continues to love us, even when we do not love Him in return. His great love overlooks sin so that we all have time for repentance.

Today's Gospel presents the story of the instantaneous conversion of the tax-collector, Zacchaeus. God's grace led him to a moment of conversion. The account describes how Jesus recognized Zacchaeus for exactly what he was, a lost sinner in need of a Savior, and how God's grace worked in Zacchaeus to lead him from curiosity to repentance, conversion, and restitution. The episode emphasizes the fact that such a conversion can only result from a person's full acceptance of the grace offered by a merciful Lord.

We are told that Zacchaeus wanted to see Jesus, to catch a glimpse of him from a distance. He was determined to see Jesus that he decided to climb a Sycamore tree to have a clear view of him. We can imagine how amazed he was when Jesus looked up, called him by name, and invited himself to stay at his house.

What about us? How determined are we to see Jesus, to come close to him? Zacchaeus had to overcome the obstacle of his small size. What are the obstacles in our lives that might prevent Jesus coming close to us? Are we too busy to give him time in our lives? Do we spend enough time in prayer? Do we hear Jesus knocking on the door of our hearts asking us to invite him more and more into our lives? Or are our hearts too taken up with many concerns that do not lead to true peace and happiness? In what way may we be hiding from Jesus?

We notice two things in this story: one, Zacchaeus is seeking to see Jesus, and he is determined that he is not going to lose this chance; and two, Jesus calls him and invites himself to spend a day at his house. And while at the house of Zacchaeus, Jesus recognizes that this man too needs salvation. The initiative comes from Jesus. God always makes the first move. Zacchaeus responds generously by promising to give half his possessions to the poor and to pay back those he has cheated. He will make amends. So, Jesus' presence to Zacchaeus has a positive and concrete impact on his lifestyle: he repents and starts the journey of changing his life. The story shows that no one is excluded from God's call to participate in the kingdom. The parable underlines that Zacchaeus is a tax collector, considered as a sinner and so despised by his fellow Jews. The kingdom is also for those who are not socially well considered or accepted and sinners who need repentance. If anyone is excluded from the kingdom, it is because they have excluded themselves! Jesus came to seek out and save those who are lost. "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a Son of Abraham" In other words being a child of God or a brother or sister of Jesus is not a matter of blood, race or culture. It is the fruit of a response to a call to be open to his message and put it in practice by sharing it with our brothers and sisters.
