




CHOIR INVITATION

ROSARY


Please join us as we pray the rosary every Sunday before Mass. We begin at 8:30 am in the new worship area & we welcome all to join in this beautiful devotional prayer.

CHRIST THE KING

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism

and hostility against the Church. Today reminds us that while governments and ideologies come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and in many parts of Europe, atheistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and-while governments around them crumbled-the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever.

Quas primas continues to ring true. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of what he referred to as "anticlericalism" by which he meant the attitude of those who were seeking to extirpate Christian influence from political life

We see a version of this same attitude today. For example, when it is suggested that belief in the Catholic teachings renders a person unfit for a judicial appointment. And in recent years, aggressive secularist campaigns have sought to marginalize the Church and other religious institutions.

When our nation is beset by political divisions, threats of war, and many broken souls we do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over every people and nation.

The Solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the Universe 11/20/2022

Today we celebrate the solemnity of The Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe. We celebrate and honor Jesus as a King, our King. And to call Jesus our King is an invitation to work for his kingdom. We have to feel, live, and behave in word and action as people of that kingdom whose King we call our KING.

Jesu is King because he has a Kingdom, but his Kingdom is not like earthly kingdoms, The Kingdom of Christ is at odds with the display of power associated with the kingdoms we are familiar with. Jesus becomes King, hanging on a cross. He becomes a king through his power to love, forgive, and save. The highest values in Jesus' Kingdom are Service and humility.

This is certainly the type of king presented in today's readings. The first reading from the Second Book of Samuel, presents the people of Israel asking David to be their King. They ask David to shepherd them. This reading is presented to tell us that Jesus' reign is in the spirit of His ancestor, King David. David was a shepherd who was given the kingdom due to his ability to fight the enemies of his people. Jesus is chosen to be King because the people need a shepherd to lead them. Jesus was the one who, like David, was able to defeat the enemies of Israel, the forces of evil. Like David, Jesus was anointed to serve the People of God.

In the Gospel of today, Luke presents Jesus on his throne, an unusual throne, the Cross. "King of the Jews was written over it". A king, who is supposed to be in his palace, sitting on his throne and surrounded by his advisers is now being humiliated and crucified. We see Jesus hanging on the cross with no one of his friends to turn too, only two thieves crucified with him, one on his right the other on his left. All his followers have left him, they are afraid that they too might be crucified like their Lord and Master. The people and soldiers are mocking Him, insulting Him, and laughing at Him because their own idea of what a king is, is not met by Jesus. They are frustrated with Jesus. They are expecting a Messiah who would liberate them from the domination of foreign powers and here comes Jesus being humiliated and degraded. Jesus instead is doing the opposite of what they expect. He turns upside down their own idea of a Messiah. He shows them a different kind of king: humble and a servant King.

One of the criminals crucified with Jesus, looked at Jesus and said, "Remember me when you come into your Kingdom." He saw that he was being crucified next to the ruler of a different kingdom. He realized that Jesus has power to forgive him, and to make him heir of that new Kingdom

Today's gospel presents this question: with whom do we identify with? Do we identify with a thief who recognized Jesus' innocence, and who realized that Jesus' death could be his passage to heaven, to a new life. Or do we identify with the other who ignored his need for forgiveness. Jesus demonstrated his power when he turned to the repentant criminal and said, "This day you will be with me in Paradise."

He is our King. His Kingdom is, as today's Preface, the prayer we say immediately before we sing the Holy Holy, tells us, is a Kingdom of truth and life, a Kingdom of holiness and grace, a Kingdom of justice, love, and peace. We have given the keys of our lives to our King. We are now called to imitate him at his most regal moment: reigning on the Cross, sacrificing himself for others, reconciling, forgiving. We are called to realize with our lives the Kingdom of truth and life, holiness, grace, justice, love, and peace.
