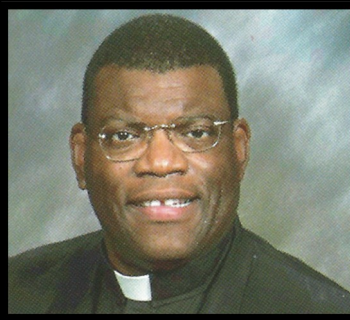

#### MASS OF RESURRECTION



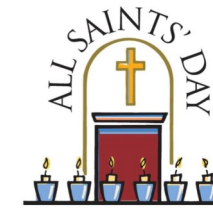
We previously announced the death of long time parishioner Jack Petralia last Monday from a stroke. Parishioners Jack and Louise joined the parish in 1995 and for all these years have been lynchpins in many ministries. We are forever grateful for Jack's leadership in the long range planning committee which developed the plans and concept for our Phase I

expansion and subsequent construction of the new worship area. His Mass of Resurrection will be celebrated tomorrow, Monday, November 7th, at 11:00am. Visitation is an hour before. A burial in the COV Cemetery will occur after the Mass with a reception immediately thereafter. Please bring a side dish or desert to share with others.



#### ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS DAY

As has been our practice in the past during November, we honor our relatives who have passed away. In the Narthex is a receptacle for memorial pictures of your loved ones. Beginning this Sunday you may bring your pictures which will be placed on a Memorial table. At that time, you can also fill a purple slip of paper with the names of the individuals you want remembered and place them in the decorative basket which will be placed on the Altar for all Masses in November.



A saint is someone who is in heaven-it is as simple as that. While "saint" as a title is reserved to those whose lives the Church has thoroughly investigated (typically through whose intercession two miracles can be demonstrated to have occurred), the term applies to anyone in Heaven.

Everyone from your saintly grandmother to the martyrs facing death for Christ: They are all part of the communion of saints. The Church commemorates all these saints on All Saints' Day.

All Saint' Day is recognized as one of the most important feasts on the liturgical calendar. However, the celebration of Halloween typically overshadows the commemoration of All Saints 'Day.

Most of us realize that Halloween is in reality the vigil of All Saint's Day("Allhallows Eve" or "Hallow E'en"), but All Saints' Day itself has become a bit of an afterthought.

It shouldn't be this way! The saints are our friends, our intercessors, our brothers and sisters in Christ. They care deeply for us, and their lives are recognized by the Church as exemplary, as models to follow.

All Soul's Day commemorates the faithful departed. In Western Christianity, this day is observed principally in the Catholic Church, although some churches of the Anglican Communion and the Old Catholic Churches also celebrate it. The Eastern Orthodox churches observe several All Soul's Days during the year. The Roman Catholic celebration is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful who at death have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and by the sacrifice of the Mass. In other words, when they died, they had not yet attained full sanctification and moral perfection, a requirement for entrance into Heaven. This is the reason why All Soul's Day is on 2 November after All Saints' Day, 1 November, which commemorates the departed who have attained the beatific vision, the Saints.

What is the purpose of life? What is your/our goal in life? Where is our journey of life aiming at? Life has one and only one ultimate goal, to prepare us for that final encounter with our God. It takes us back to Him, and we live with and in Him forever!

So, as we near the end of the Church's liturgical year, the readings become more to do with the end times. The main theme of today's readings is the reality of life after death and of the relationship between our lives on earth and the life of glory that will follow. The readings invite us to consider the true meaning of our faith in a God who is a Living God.

The first reading from Maccabees tells of seven brothers and their mother who are arrested and tortured for their faith in God. Because of their Faith in, and obedience to, God, they endure suffering and accept martyrdom. During their torture, three of the brothers speak, and each of them finds strength in the belief that he will eventually be raised and rewarded by God. They all believed very firmly that God had a place for them beyond death. Today's second reading from Paul's letter to the Thessalonians calls for us to be delivered from perverse and wicked people for not all have faith. He encourages the Thessalonians to trust in the fidelity of God Who would strengthen their hearts in every good work and word. And the Gospel reading from Luke focuses on the Sadducees who deny there is a resurrection.

The Sadducees are described in this Gospel as opponents to the belief in resurrection. In the dialogue presented here, we see an example of the means of disputation that was common in first century Judaism. The Sadducees use the example of Levirate marriage, found in the Law of Moses, to disprove belief in the resurrection. According to Deuteronomy 25:5-10, if a man died without producing an heir, the man's brother should marry his wife and the offspring of this union would inherit the property and carry on the name of the man who had died. The Sadducees use this as an example to challenge belief in the resurrection.

Jesus argues from the same written Law of Moses to show that there is resurrection. Using the texts from the Book of Exodus (Chapter 3) that describe Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush, Jesus shows that God is the God of the living, not the dead. Here Jesus uses the same method and texts of the Sadducees to counter them.

More importantly, in this discourse Jesus shows the limits of our imaginations when it comes to eternal life. The Sadducees argued against resurrection because of the limits of earthly existence. They did not imagine another possibility for existence and relationship with God. Jesus proposes that the possibilities of resurrected life are beyond our imaginations. In the new life after death, we will be free of the bodily needs and appetites of this present experience. We will be like children in God's presence, fully content, no longer needing what we need in this world. Jesus' conclusion suggests something else as well: To spend time worrying about resurrected life is to miss the point. The point is eternal relationship with God is possible, for God is the God of the living, ". . . for to him all are alive."

Therefore, we need to live as people of the living God, of the Resurrection. This means that we are not to lie buried in the tomb of our sins and of our habits of this earthly life. Instead, we are to live joyful and peaceful lives, constantly experiencing the real Presence of the Risen Lord, the living God.




