## FOUR ADVENT CANDLES

- As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us.
- The Prophecy Candle: The first purple, or violet candle, is the Prophecy Candle symbolizes hope and God's forgiveness toward man. It also can symbolize the expectation of the coming of the Messiah. (Hope)
- The Bethlehem Candle: During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem. (Peace)
- The Shepherd's Candle: The third candle which is pink or rose, represents Gaudette Sunday and the joy that the birth of Christ brought to the world. Traditionally, on Gaudette Sunday one takes a break from Advent fasting to experience the joy of the day. The Shepherd's candle is sometimes white instead of rose or pink. (Joy)
- The Angel's Candle: During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son. We reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel. (Love)
- The Christ Candle: If a white candle in the middle of the wreath is included, this candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day and represents Christ and purity. The Christ Candle is lit every night until the Feast of the Epiphany, which is twelve days from Christmas.

# ANGELS

The Christian tradition has retained a strong belief in angels.

- The New Testament has over twice as many references to angels as the Old Testament. In the Gospels, angels appear and speak only in the infancy narrative and at the empty tomb.
- The Church has made few pronouncements about angels. It teaches that angels are created beings (not mini-gods)...that they are personal (not simply "forces")...and that they do not have a material body (though when necessary, they can appear in a human form).
- People find comfort in knowing that there are created beings who can use their superior powers to help them, and that there are "guardian angels" to watch their every step.

#### Fourth Sunday of Advent, 12/182022

On this fourth Sunday of Advent our focus is on Mary and Joseph, the parents of Jesus, the Messiah. And in a special way, today Mathew wants us to focus on the person and role of Joseph. He is a key character in the whole story of Jesus as the sent, son of God, the promised Messiah to come.

Matthew's Gospel contains more about St Joseph than any of the other Gospel writers. St Luke mentions him seven times but none of these tell us very much about Joseph himself. He only gets one brief mention in the Gospel of Mark and two passing references in the Gospel of John. But for Jesus to full fill the Messianic prophecy given by Isaiah, Joseph had to, and freely, accept Jesus as his son, thus, making Him (Jesus) a descendant of David. It is Joseph, the husband of Mary, who connects Jesus to David.

We admire Joseph because he does not question the Angel; he simply does what he is asked to do, recognizing that these instructions come ultimately from God. Like Mary he accepts God's will. We would do well to imitate Joseph in our own lives especially when we are faced with circumstances which are far from ideal. We should take him for our model and do the right thing at the time when it is needed.

We also focus on the name given to the child to be born, by the prophets, especially Isaiah in today's first reading. " The Virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel". In the Gospel we are given the meaning of Emmanuel, "God is with us".

This is indeed Good News. We have a God who does not wish to be far away from us but desires 'to be with us', to be near those he loves. Sadly, it is we who often keep God at a distance, maybe because of fear of committing our lives to him.

God who wants to be near us, to be with us, to dwell among us. But he doesn't force his way into our lives. He comes knocking on the door of our hearts, asking permission to enter our world and our lives. Like Joseph and Mary, we need to trust in God, listen to Him and be faithful. We need to experience the Emmanuel in our lives and change the world: The Good News and the consoling message of Christmas is that the Child Jesus still waits today to step into our hearts and to change us and the world around us by his love, kindness, mercy and compassion.

Christmas is a time of experiencing God's love through the gift of his son Jesus who comes to dwell among us. And the only gift he expects from us in return is our willingness to allow him to come into our lives and through us into the world. Because the goodness and love of God can only be present in our world when we are good to each other. His forgiveness and kindness are present when we are forgiving and kind to each other. Likewise with his compassion, patience, gentleness.

In these final days of Advent, as we prepare ourselves to celebrate the feast of Christmas, let's not, however, focus only on

all the practical preparations, all the shopping, all the decorating and all the cooking. But to understand that it is far more important for us, at this particular time to focus on the actual events of Christ's birth, who Jesu really is. And what does this mean and stands for in our lives. This will make the joy in our hearts great and meaningful as we celebrate the feast of Christmas.


