ADULT FAITH FORMATION

Take Home Lesson for February 12, 2023

Implications of the New Law

Last Sunday, our adult faith formation lesson happened to be entitled "Christian Moral Living" and included what the Church teaches about formation of our moral conscience. The worksheet for our lesson included two verses from today's Gospel.

Today we hear Jesus urging us toward a higher standard. Jesus affirms the Ten Commandments, but then tells us to move beyond legalism to what truly fosters love.

Other than Jesus explicitly saying that being angry and holding a grudge falls under the jurisdiction of "Thou shalt not kill," how are we to know that we are really reaching the higher standard that Jesus is urging us toward?

In the first reading today, we heard "If you choose, you can keep the commandments, they will save you." (Sirach 15:15)

When we choose, we can know that we are choosing well by listening to that voice from inside, our moral conscience.

The Church teaches that when a person listens to his conscience, the prudent man can hear God Speaking. (CCC 1777)

Our faith formation small group discussion last week also included what the Catechism says about the formation of conscience.

In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path; we must assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice. We must examine our conscience before the Lord's Cross. We are assisted by the gifts of the Holy Spirit, aided by witness or advice of others and guided by the authoritative teaching of the Church. (CCC 1785)

Sacred scripture, especially the teachings of Jesus Christ, the teachings of the church, the influence of family, the influence of responsible friends - all of these will help us make good moral choices based on love rather than law.

Once again we see the Catechism using the image of our path being lit with the light of Christ. That light is the light of love.

Living a life in harmony with the love of Christ may put us at odds with secular society. At times we may make choices that will cause others to ask, "Why are they acting that way?" with the only satisfactory answer being, "Because they believe in Jesus Christ."

Since actions do speak louder than words, perhaps this week we could examine our conscience by asking ourselves:

If you were arrested for being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict you?

To supplement our devotional activities, we will have the Black Books featuring 10 minutes of daily readings during Lent and the Word Among us. More information will follow as we finalize the schedule.

The 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time "A"

February 12, 2023

One day someone asked Mother Teresa, "What God wants us to do and how will He judge us in the end?" She responded, "I believe that when we die and the time comes for us to be judged, God will not ask how many good things we did in our lives, but only with how much love we did them." We need to obey God's law, appreciating its main principles. The two main principles are reverence and love.

This is the spirit in which we have to understand the Gospel of today. Jesus begins by saying that he did come to abolish the law, but to fulfill it, and he goes on to explain what he means by fulfilling the law. That trying to keep the law is not enough, one has to go beyond mere observance of the commandments. That is what Jesus is saying by: "I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven". For How could anyone be more righteous than the Pharisees and the scribes? The Pharisees followed the law and did what they were supposed to do. They paid their debts, observed their religious rituals, they fasted. They said loud prayers for all to hear and were leaders in their communities. They were respected by people because they were the ones who knew the Laws of God than anyone else. And that's why they were the ones to teach other how to observe the Laws of God. Yet we hear Jesus telling us: "Unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and the Pharisees, you shall not enter the kingdom of God."

It is evident therefore, that being a strict follower of the rules isn't good enough. Jesus expects us to be better than just followers of rules and laws. For Jesus, righteousness is not a question of merely observing the Commandments; it is not a question of what I must do to observe the law. It is a question of how I do, what I am supposed to do. It is my attitude that matters.

The goodness of the Pharisees was superficial; they only kept up appearances. Likewise, for us, just because we appear to be good on the outside doesn't necessarily mean that we are good on the inside. We may never commit Murder, adultery, or theft, but our hearts can be filled with hatred, lust, untruthfulness. We may never be convicted of theft, but we can rob another person of their value in the eyes of others, by the way we talk about them, or what we say behind their backs. You may never physically hurt or harm another person, but you can ignore them and give them little or no attention.

Jesus wants us to be good outside and good on the inside. This is a question of Character, personal character that you are what you are. What people see is exactly what you are. It is not a matter of keeping the law, or observing it, but to live by the law and make it part of our lives. It is genuine love that matters, not just words or appearances.

To observe means to follow the letter of the Law; to live it means to go beyond the letter of the law True Christians follow the law and commandments of God and the Church out of love. They love God, they love Jesus, and they love their brothers and sisters. Their only concern is how they can serve with love.

#2 THE IMPORTANCE OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass:

"Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

Some important prayers that are used during this rite include the Anima Christi (en español) and the Tantum Ergo.

We will start Adoration March 2nd after 9am Mass.
