

Take Home Lesson for Sunday

July 2, 2023

Showing Christ to Others

In today's Gospel, Jesus continues to instruct his disciples before they are sent out with special healing authority on their mission to the "lost sheep of the tribe of Israel." The apostles can expect to be persecuted by those who refuse to listen to them, but they should "Fear no one."

In the first part of today's gospel, Jesus gives the disciples a challenging command that would be hard to reconcile to the ways we actually feel about our family members:

"Whoever loves father and mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." (Matthew 10:39)

Bishop Robert Barron comments that such a command would be, for an ordinary human being, the height of arrogance. It would be coherent and sensible if and only if the one who issued it were himself the highest good, that which surpasses any value in this world. Once we understand who Jesus truly is, then we have a decision to make. If he is in person the supreme value, then we have to give our whole life to him. It's as simple and as deeply challenging as that.

After Jesus challenges the apostles to give themselves fully to himself and their mission, he shifts his instruction to what awaits those who encounter the disciples on mission: "Whoever receives you, receives me."

Scripture scholar Catherine Cory comments that the disciples are about to be sent out to be Jesus' presence among the people they meet and, as Jesus' representatives, they are like wise agents of God. Similarly, if we insist on holding onto what we value in our daily lives, Jesus says we will lose it. But if we perform acts of hospitality, even if only a cup of water for the least of God's children, we will receive God's reward.

In thinking about what it means to love Jesus more than we love our own children, here is the Take Home Question for this week:

When have you been able to put what someone else needs ahead of what you want for yourself?






