

No experience necessary! We have books and rosary beads available for use. If you have any questions please see Cindy Jessee.



Take Home Lesson for Sunday

July 23, 2023

Overcoming Weakness

In today's second reading, Saint Paul talks of how God helps us with our prayers.

"Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words." (Romans 8:26)

Here is related teaching from the Catechism: Are we convinced that "we do not know how to pray as we ought"? Are we asking God for "what is good for us"? Our Father knows what we need before we ask him, but he awaits our petition because the dignity of his children lies in their freedom. We must pray, then, with his Spirit of freedom, to be able to truly know what he wants. (CCC 2736)

At a workshop in Richmond last week, Professor John Cuddeback of Christendom College suggested that what God wants is a relationship of friendship with us. He cited this commentary from Pope Saint John Paul II related to strengthening our friendship with the Lord:

"We have to learn to pray, as if learning anew from the lips of the Divine Master himself, like the first disciples: "Lord, teach us to pray!" (Luke 11:1) Prayer develops that conversation with Christ which makes us his intimate friends: "Abide in me and I in you" (John 15:4). This reciprocity is the very substance and soul of the Christian life. Wrought in us by the Holy Spirit, this reciprocity opens us, through Christ and in Christ, to contemplation of the Father's face."


While at supper with his apostles on the night before his death, Jesus promised them that the Father would send the Holy Spirit in his name, "And he will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have told you." (John 14:26)

And then, Jesus tells his apostles that he no longer calls them servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but, "I have called you friends, for all I have heard from my Father I have made known to you." (John 15:15)

From the Father to the Son, then taught by the Holy Spirit, we are all invited into a relationship of friendship. A rich understanding of friendship can help us to understand our weaknesses, to understand sin. God has a problem with sin because it gets in the way of friendship.

Thinking about how our weaknesses and sinfulness get in the way of our friendship with God, here is the Take Home Questions for this week:

What weakness can the power of the Holy Spirit help you overcome?



#### SUMMER READING FOR THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

For the last several months, the Pastoral Parish Council has been reading and discussing the book entitled Eucharist, in which Bishop Robert Barron analyzes the source and summit of the Christian life according to the categories of sacred meal, sacrifice and

Bishop Barron's text from Eucharist has been adapted into a slightly condensed book written specifically for the Eucharistic Revival entitled This Is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival.

We have received our initial stockpile of books and invite interested parishioners to add this book to their summer reading collection. Please pick up a copy after Mass from John Weidner or stop by the church office during the week.

As you read through this short (110 pages) book, please consider highlighting or marking up those parts that especially move you or might inspire you to share what you read with another parishioner.

Later this fall, parishioners will be invited to participate in a number of revival activities, including small group discussions, a guest speaker presentation, a movie night and other opportunities for fellowship centered on The Eucharist. We expect these activities will be more productive if attendees have already read through this short book.

#### FR. JOHN BODDIE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Annually we solicit donations for this scholarship fund, designed to help parishioners with higher education and the parish itself with on-going adult education.

The donations purchase an add in our bulletin for one year. This Sunday after Mass we will hand out donation request letters to parishioners. By mail we will solicit donations from local businesses and former donors unaffiliated with the parish.



The scholarship committee met recently to approve changes to the applications designed to simplify them and the process. In review, scholarships are available from the fund for high school seniors entering college, higher and post-graduate education, continuing education, and special adult education. #### WATER DAMAGE UPDATE

As you are aware, several weeks ago we suffered major damage to the admin and daily chapel wing from a clogged drainage pipe and overflowing toilet.

Servpro accomplished the water mitigation and has settled with our insurance carrier. Two weeks and a half ago, Mill End carpeting laid new carpet in the Daily Chapel, the Pastor's Office and Admin Office. week The installation of the new baseboards was completed this past Tuesday. Unfortunately, we detected new damage to three desks which had become waterlogged and need to be fixed.

We need to seek an estimate of repair for the desks and proceed accordingly. We are insured through the Diocese and have met their \$1,000 deductible requirement.

The Diocese risk management office has been extremely helpful in this situation with advice and the processing of claims.

### UNDERSTANDING THE CHURCH CALENDAR Part 3

#### MEMORIALS

The third category of celebrations and those most representative of what we call "feast days" are properly known as memorials. Memorials are identified as either obligatory, those that must be celebrated universally on an assigned day, or optional, meaning it is up to the celebrant as to whether that particular saint is celebrated. All memorials are fixed on the annual calendar. Memorials most often honor and focus us on the pious life of a saint. If Scripture mentions the particular saint, then the Mass readings on that day are taken from the applicable Scripture, such as, on the obligatory memorial of St. Martha the readings are from John (chapter 11) or Luke (chapter 10). If the saint is not mentioned in Scripture, then the readings are the ordinary, or normal, readings assigned for that day.

Optional memorials often identify a saint special or familiar to a particular location or religious order, but are often those not necessarily well known throughout the worldwide Church. For example, Sept. 19 is the optional memorial to St. Januarius, the patron saint of Naples, Italy. While the people of Naples and the surrounding area may well remember and acknowledge Januarius, a parish in another part of the world may not. The local parish priest normally decides about recognizing optional memorials.

As every country honors her founding fathers, her national heroes, independence day, and other national events, so does the Church celebrate the great sacred mysteries — the life of Jesus, the Blessed Mother, the saints and the martyrs who died for the faith. The Church classifies each celebration according to its importance and ranks them on the annual liturgical calendar as a solemnity, a feast or a memorial.

#### FERIAL DAYS

If we look carefully at the Church liturgical calendar, there are some days that have no celebration assigned; no solemnity, no feast, no memorial. Such days are known as a "ferial" days, from a Latin word meaning free. In ancient Rome the term referred to a holiday, especially for slaves.

On the liturgical calendar, a ferial day is always on a weekday, Monday through Friday, and occurs during Ordinary Time. On that day the priest has the option of celebrating the previous Sunday Mass, a votive Mass or a Mass acknowledging any saint he desires. The celebrant may select the readings or use those appointed in the Lectionary for that day.
