

Take Home Lesson

August 13, 2023

Faith In The Lord

This week's Take Home Lesson is adapted from Bishop Robert Barron's commentary on today's Gospel from the fourteen chapter of Matthew and the narrative of Jesus walking on water.

We hear that after dismissing the crowds whom he had been teaching, Jesus went up a mountain by himself to pray. The Church Fathers interpreted this as Jesus going to the right hand of the Father after his earthly ministry in order to intercede for his Church here below. As he prays, the disciples set out in a boat, under the leadership of Peter, to cross to the other side of the Sea of Galilee. Whenever the disciples are gathered in a boat, the Fathers insisted, we are dealing with a symbol of the Church. In this case, the journey across the sea represents the passage of the followers of Jesus through time. When it was evening, Matthew tells us, the boat was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. The Church has indeed faced, throughout the centuries, storm after storm.

But Jesus, we hear, came toward them walking on the sea. Christ, walking on the tumultuous waves, is the divine power that sustains the Church even during its greatest challenges. And this is precisely why the Lord calls out to Peter, the leader of the disciples, urging him to walk on the water with him. When the Church trusts in the Lord, it finds stability even as crisis and trouble surge around us. When Peter takes his eyes off of Jesus and notices the bounding main, he commences to sink; so does the Church when it attends more to the storm than to the Master.

Matthew narrates: Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Matthew 14:31)

When the Lord enters the boat, the winds die down, and the disciples confess him to be the Son of God and commence to worship him. This symbolizes the culmination of the Church's life in heaven, when we are beyond the storms of this life and can give ourselves utterly to the praise of God.

Matthew will end his account of the Gospel with Jesus saying: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

Reflecting on how Jesus can calm the storms that rage about each of us through out our lives, here is the Question of the Week:

How do you know Jesus is with you at all times?

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

On August 15, the Church celebrates the fact that Mary, the Mother of God, was assumed into Heaven at the end of her earthly life. This significant feast day recalls the spiritual and physical departure of the mother of Jesus Christ from the earth, when both her soul and her body were taken into the presence of God

The Catechism of the Catholic Church

CCC 966 "Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death" (Pope Pius XII, Munificentissimus Deus). The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians: In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death (Byzantine Liturgy, Troparion, Feast of the Dormition)

What does the Assumption of Mary teach us?

In a homily for the Assumption, Pope St. John Paul II said,

* Taken up into Heaven, Mary shows us the way to God, the

- * Taken up into Heaven, Mary shows us the way to God, the way to Heaven, the way to life.
- * She opens this way especially to the little ones and to the poor, those who are dear to divine mercy.
- * The Queen of the world reveals to individuals and to nations the power of the love of God...."
- In the assumption of Mary into Heaven we are shown the eternal destiny that awaits us beyond the mystery of death: a destiny of total happiness in divine glory. This supernatural vision sustains our daily pilgrimage.
- * Mary teaches about life. By looking at her, we understand better the relative value of earthly greatness and the full sense of our Christian vocation." – St. John Paul II

Venerable Pope Pius XII confirmed this belief about the virgin Mary as the perennial teaching of the Church when he defined it formally as a dogma of Catholic faith in 1950, invoking papal infallibility to proclaim, "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."


