Take Home Lesson

August 20, 2023

All Are Welcome

Last week's Gospel told the dramatic story of Jesus calling out to Peter to join him in walking upon the stormy sea. When Peter takes his focus off Jesus, when he begins to doubt, he starts to sink into the restless waters.

The Catechism links that story and today's story of the persistent Canaanite woman:

Just as Jesus prays to the Father and gives thanks before receiving his gifts, so he teaches filial boldness: "Whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you receive it, and you will." Such is the power of prayer and of faith that does not doubt: "all things are possible to him who believes." Jesus is as saddened by "the lack of faith" of his own neighbors and the "little faith" of his own disciples as he is struck with admiration at the great faith of the Roman Centurion and the Canaanite woman. (CCC 2610)

In his teaching, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray with a purified heart, with lively and persevering faith, with filial boldness. He calls them to vigilance and invites them to present their petitions to God in his name. Jesus Christ himself answers prayers addressed to him. (CCC 2621)

This term filial boldness used in the Catechism means to pray with a faith that refuses to doubt.


Taking these words apart, we find the term "filial" means "of or due from a son or a daughter" and the term "boldness," in a Biblical context, means "confidence," "fearlessness," and "freedom of speech."

Although Jesus does not answer the women when she first calls out, he has every intention of granting her request; it is only because of his loving plan for her and for us that he delays. The Lord brought out into the open the greatness of her faith.

Fearless and confident, the Canaanite woman persists. She approaches Jesus with the same boldness that a son or daughter would approach a parent. Jesus invites all of us to approach him as his children, to ask anything in his name, and he will do it. All are welcome, no one is excluded, "For my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples." (Isaiah 56:7)

The Canaanite woman is persistent in prayer. As we reflect on what it means to pray with a faith that refuse to doubt, here is the Question of the Week:

For what do you ask God to give you most often?
