

Take Home Lesson

September 3, 2023

Taking Up The Cross

Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel follows immediately after last week's Gospel reading which featured Peter's great profession of faith.

We again offer commentary from scripture scholar Stephen Wilbricht: "While Peter is able to identify Jesus as the Christ, he is unwilling to accept Jesus' humble acceptance of God's will, which would lead to his suffering and eventual death. Side by side, these two passages demonstrate the difficulty of holding together the horror of the cross with the messianic nature of the person Jesus."

In his private rebuke of Peter, for attempting to shield him from suffering, Jesus reminds Peter that he is failing to discern the will of God. "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." (Matt 16:23)


As spiritual writer Father Bonaventure Perquin discusses thinking as God does, he says, "We need to discipline our imagination and learn to live every day as it comes, remembering that God's will is infinitely wise, merciful, and tender, and that he unfailingly gives us the grace we nee ditto accept his will, but only at the exact moment we need it. then we really live by faith, trust and love."

Wilbricht continues: "Peter is viewing power and authority as humans naturally would. However, Jesus turns to his disciples as a whole and tell them the true nature of power and authority, namely, what will come to be celebrated in the Church as the paschal mystery."

"Discipleship involves a willingness to die to self in order to find life again in service to others. Jesus outlines this threefold movement: denial of self, taking up the cross, and following after him. Far from seeking the reward of glory, the very purpose of following Jesus is the carrying of the cross. Profit and gain are overturned in Christian discipleship; Christians are to give themselves away in order to receive all that Christ will have in store when he returns in glory."

Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." (Matt 16:24) Familiar though Jesus' command may be, it is challenging, something the most devout Christian might not be able to do. Nevertheless, this week we ask:

In what concrete ways do you take up your cross and follow Jesus?

- •Between the ages of 30 and 59 at the time of application.
- •Committed to and living out values of justice, charity and service.
- •Demonstrates grateful fidelity to all that the Church teaches, openness to formation, and leadership.

Following these sessions, a new cohort of permanent deacons will be formed in 2024. Our permanent deacons are assigned to a parish where they exercise liturgical and catechetical ministries within their parish communities. Deacons hold roles both in their church and in a variety secular professions, showing how unique this vocation is. Please prayerfully discern whether you may be called to join a thriving and essential vocation to serve the Church in a new way. 


