

Take Home Lesson September 10, 2023

United in Love, Helping Others Grow


Pope Benedict XVI writes that theme of brotherly love in the community of believers stands out in today's scripture readings. The source of this love lies in the communion of the Trinity. The Apostle Paul says that the whole Law of God finds fullness in love, so that in our relationships with others the Ten Commandments and every other precept are summed up in these words: Love your neighbor as yourself.

The Gospel text on the life of the Christian community tells us that brotherly love also involves a sense of mutual responsibility. For this reason if my brother commits a sin against me I must treat him charitably and, first of all, speak to him privately, pointing out that what he has done or said is wrong. This approach is know as "fraternal correction": it is not a reaction to the offense suffered but is motivated by love for one's brethren. Saint Augustine comments: "Whoever has offended you, in offending you, has inflicted serious injury upon himself; and would you not care for a brother's injury?...You must forget the offense you have received but not the injury of one of your brethren." We are responsible for each other in the journey of Christian life. Each person, aware of his limitations and shortcomings, is called to accept fraternal correction and to help others with this specific service.

Another fruit of love in the community is unanimous prayer. Jesus said: If two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them. Personal prayer is important, even indispensable. But the Lord guarantees his presence to the community which is united and in agreement, because this reflects the very reality of the Triune God, perfect communion of love. We should practice both fraternal correction - which demands deep humility and simplicity of heart - and prayer so that it may rise to God from a community truly united in Christ.

Monsignor Charles Pope comments that fraternal correction is central to healthy families, a healthy church, and a healthy culture. In recent times we have done very poorly with this on every level. Our lack of charitable and clear correction goes a long way in explaining the moral confusion and darkness of our time. All of us need to recover a healthy respect for this act of charity toward the sinner and justice toward the wider community. In addition, all of us need to be more open to correction ourselves. With this in mind, our Question of the Week asks:

How have you been able to follow Christ more closely because others patiently loved you?

ADULT FAITH FORMATION **SMALL GROUP STUDY**

Eucharist: Sacred Meal, Sacrifice, Real Presence

One of the outcomes from the Synod consultations held early last year was a need for additional education about fundamental teachings and beliefs of the Catholic Church, especially the church's teaching on the Sacrament of Communion.

As part of our efforts to address this need, and since we are in the Year of Parish Eucharistic Revival, Adult Faith Formation is planning a small group study entitled "Eucharist: Sacred Meal, Sacrifice, Real Presence" to be held in October and November.

This study will examine in more detail the themes addressed by Bishop Robert Barron in his short book. This Is My Body - A Call to Eucharistic Revival, which many of us have been reading this summer. Some folks have had difficulty reading through some of Bishop Barron's academic and philosophical prose. Other folks may have enjoyed reading the material, but have not yet taken the initiative to share what they have learned. Perhaps joining this small group study will give us a chance to learn together and learn from each other.

During each session of the small group study, we will watch and listen to a short (less than 25 minutes) DVD presentation and then break out into smaller groups for discussion. Each participant will have a study guide that has commentary, questions for understanding and questions for application. There are some additional short readings from scripture and the Catechism.

We are planning to offer each session twice weekly, on Monday evening, starting at 6:00 and on Wednesday morning after Mass at 9:45. Each session goes about an hour, maybe a little longer. Our working schedule for the study is:


Session 1: Introduction - Mon, Oct 9 and Wed, Oct 11 Session 2: Sacred Meal - Mon, Oct 16 and Wed, Oct 18

Session 3: Sacrifice - Mon, Oct 30 and Wed, Nov 1 Session 4: Real Presence - Part I Mon, Nov 6 and Wed,

Nov 8

Session 5: Real Presence, Part 11 - Mon, Nov 13 and Wed, Nov 15
