Take Home Lesson

November 5, 2023

Practice What You Preach - Serving in Humble Love

Scripture scholar Catherine Cory explains today's Gospel is an introduction to Matthew's version of the woes that Jesus issues against these crimes and Pharisees. A woe is an expression of grief followed by charges against the persons to whom a woe is directed. Like Malachi's charges against the temple priests in the first reading, Jesus' charges against the scribes and Pharisees highlight the human condition and the potential for people in positions of power to abuse their authority. Thus, in today's Gospel reading, Jesus advises his disciples and the crowd that they should heed the teachings of the experts in the Law, but they should not follow their example.

"Therefore, do whatever they teach you and follow it; but do not do as they do, for they do not practice what they teach." (Matthew 23:3)

Jesus names specific practices that these people employ to bring attention to themselves and impose heavy religious burdens on those who have less power. Phylacteries, the small leather boxes worn on the forehead or the left arm, and tassels are both intended to be reminders to follow covenant law but making them bigger and longer is aviation of the spirit of the law. No matter a person's station on earth, even if they are in positions of honor or power or instruction, there is only one who deserves the full weight of those titles: God.

Jesus' message is one of humble service: "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." (Matthew 23:12)

Do we not realize at times that we fail to "practice what we preach?" That we struggle to live up to the ideals we profess as Christians? Rather than be discouraged by such self-knowledge, we take heart that the Lord has given us sacraments of healing. In the sacrament of confession, for example, we know that our fallenness, our sin, does not have the last word. Cleansed through God's mercy, we can renew our commitment to love God with all of our heart, all of our soul, and all of our mind. Then, as our Lord humbled himself to share in our humanity, we can humble ourselves in service to others.

Reflecting on those times we fell short of living our lives according to what we believe, this week we ask:

What service could you perform this week for someone in need?

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

Eucharist: Sacred Meal, Sacrifice, Real Presence

During October and November, some parishioners are meeting in small groups to study our most holy and perfect sacrament. Please continue to watch this space for reflections and commentary about the Eucharist.

A key message from last Sunday's Gospel, emphasized by Father Koo throughout the Mass, was Jesus' instruction that we should love God "with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." Recall when Jesus said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan. You are not thinking as God does, but as human beings do." (Matthew 16:23)

It seems that Jesus is giving us an idea of how we should be loving as God does. After all, God is nothing but love. Let's take a look at how God as a family of love connects to this week's Eucharist study topic.

The theme of this past week's study was Sacred Meal. Several of the Biblical images of the sacred banquet were discussed. From the beginning, in the Book of Genesis, Adam and Eve enjoy easy friendship with God in a sort of banquet setting, eating whatever they choose, until they separate themselves from God by grasping at divinity. God establishes the Passover meal for his chosen people so that they can remember their deliverance from slavery. Ultimately, as seen by Isaiah's vision, God sets for us a heavenly banquet on his mountain where he gathers all nations in peace.

These Old Testament meals provide the backdrop for the Incarnate Word, placed in a manger in Bethlehem, signifying Jesus' destiny to become food for our souls. At the Last Supper, gathered in fellowship with his friends, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples, said, "Take and eat; this is my body."

Bishop Barron concludes his exploration of the theme of Scared Meal with his description of God as a family of love, a sharing of life, breathing in and breathing out, a looking toward another. He observes that the whole history of salvation can be read as the Trinitarian God's attempt to draw the human family into a relationship that mimics the love that God is. When we love God with our whole heart and mind, we necessarily love all those whom God has loved into existence.

This family love is expressed in the great biblical image of the sacred banquet. The Eucharist sums it up and brings it perfect expression, and hence the Eucharist is the richest participation in the very being of God who is nothing but love.
