

Take Home Lesson

December 17, 2023

Prepare the Way of the Lord

During this Liturgical Year B which we are just beginning, the Gospel readings will be primarily from Mark. Mark's account is the shortest and the earliest written of the four Gospels, starting with seven Greek words a first century Jewish person would find especially bold and startling: "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God." (Mark 1:1) The "good news" story that Mark will tell is radically different from the long line of stories of teachers and prophets familiar to that first century Jewish person.

As with the other two liturgical years that draw Gospel readings primarily from Matthew or Luke, there will be several Sunday Gospel readings during this year that are drawn from the Gospel according to John, and today's reading is from the prologue of John's Gospel.

Near the beginning of all four Gospels, the Evangelists feature John the Baptist and quote Isaiah: "A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the Lord." (Isaiah 40:3)

While the Gospels according to Matthew and Luke begin by listing Jesus' human ancestors and the narrative of his human birth, the Gospels according to Mark and John announce Jesus' divine nature from the very beginning.

Today's Gospel reading, like last week's from the very beginning of the Gospel according to Mark, also emphasizes the role of John the Baptist in preparing the way of the Lord.

We hear that John the Baptist was sent by God to testify to the light. John is clearly characterized as "not the light," thus highlighting Jesus as the light to whom John is a witness. This is reinforced later in John's Gospel when Jesus states, "I am the light of the world." (John 8:12)

Bishop Robert Barron offers this commentary of today's Gospel:

"From time immemorial, God has sent messengers, spokespersons. Think of all the prophets and patriarchs of Israel, indeed every sage, philosopher, artist or poet who has communicated something of God's truth and beauty. All of these could be characterized as witnesses to the light."

"The point is that the one to whom the Baptist beast witness is someone qualitatively different - not one more bearer of the Word, however impressive, but the Word himself. This counters the tendency - as prevalent today as in the ancient world - to domesticate Jesus and turn him into one more in a long line of prophets and seers."

The beginnings of the Gospels according to John and Mark help us reflect upon this week's question:

What is different about Jesus that sets him apart from just another teacher, prophet, or seer?

SECOND COLLECTION

Our second collection today is to benefit the work of Catholic Charities of Eastern Virginia (CCEVA) in the Hampton Roads region. The collection comprises most of the financial support that CCEVA receives from the Diocese and is critical to our ability to respond to the needs of our community.

GAUDETE SUNDAY "JOY"

The color of the Season of Advent is violet. In order to distinguish between Advent and Lent, the bluer hues of violet may be used. Rose colored vesture will be worn on the Third Sunday of Advent, which is termed Gaudete Sunday.

What is special about the Third Sunday of the Church's history? This Sunday has a special name: "Gaudete" Sunday. On this day the season of Advent shifts its focus. For the first two weeks of Advent, the focus can be summed up in the phrase, "The Lord is coming." But beginning with Gaudete Sunday, the summary might be, "The Lord in near." This shift is marked by a lighter mood and a heightened sense of joyous anticipation. Liturgically, the colors lighten as well. The priest usually wears rose colored vestments, a hue seen only on Gaudete Sunday and Laetare Sunday in Lent. On this day, we light the third candle of the Advent wreath, which is also rose-colored, or if you prefer, pink.

Why is the third Sunday of Advent known as Gaudete Sunday? Its name is taken from the entrance antiphon of the Mass, which is:

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

This is a quotation from Philippians 4:4-5, and in Latin, the first word of the antiphon is Gaudete (Latin, "rejoice" it's also pronounced with three syllables: gau-de-te).

SING-A-LONG

One of the features of our Christmas Eve sing-a-long (starting at 6:30pm) is the Children's pageant, which will occur concurrently. This is a change from the past when the pageant took place during the Mass.

ATTENTION TO DETAIL

Recently, we have encountered several instances of the misuse of utilities or a failure to safeguard the premises, after a parish entity, group, or even an individual has used our building. (*Please view our November electricity bill in the financial section*).

Notably, lights are left on, the heat is left on high or air conditioning set low, or an outside door left open.

If you are using the building after normal office hours, (or the last one to leave), please be vigilant about these things and ensure we have a secure building that's not lighted, heated, or cooled unnecessarily.

We all share a responsibility to shepherd our resources.

Consider this visionary image of a community of believers as an example of goodness, presented by Jesus to his disciples and embraced by the early church:

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16)

The early church envisioned itself as a light to the world. Through its actions of justice and service, it would reveal the presence of the God who had acted powerfully through Jesus.

Our mission is to prayerfully study, proclaim, and live the Word of God; celebrate the Eucharist; and serve the local community.




