

Take Home Lesson

December 24, 2023

#### ACCEPTANCE OF GOD'S WILL

Last week's take home lesson incorrectly stated that Luke's Gospel begins by listing Jesus' human ancestors and the narrative of his birth. In fact, Luke does not address the genealogy of Jesus until the end of Chapter 3 of his account of the Gospel. And, oh by the way, Luke traces Jesus' ancestors back to Adam, the son of God. What we have in the first two chapters of Luke is not only the most extensive narrative of the birth of Jesus, but also the beautiful and inspiring stories of the announcements of the births of John and Jesus and a favorite of our parish, our namesake story of Mary's visit with Elizabeth.

Today's Gospel reading from the first chapter of Luke tells of Mary's encounter with the angel Gabriel and her ready assent to her role in God's plan that is not only for her but for all of humanity. Gabriel's first word of greeting also begins our Blessed Mother's prayer. "Hail Mary" translates in Latin to "Ave Maria".

Bishop Robert Barron comments that the Church Fathers consistently referred to Mary as the New Eve. The "Ave" of the angel was seen as the reversal of "Eva." Mary reverses the disobedience of Eve with her unquestioning obedience to the will of God. While Eve grasped at divinity, Mary said, "May it be done unto me."

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to you word." (Luke 1:38)

Scripture scholar Maria Enid Barga provides this commentary:

"Mary's yes to God points to her 'obedience of faith' to which we are called. Mary is the first human to await the proximate birth of Christ and the ushering in of salvation. For a short while, she is the only one who knows the full extent of God's faithfulness in fulfilling his promises to David and his people. As such, her response to the angel serves as a model for our own response to the birth of Christ. Like Mary, we should assent to God's salvific activity in our own lives, entrusting our entire being to God's plan and providential care. In so doing, our entire life can become a doxology (a hymn of praise to God) that continually recognizes and praises the glory of God and his power manifested in our lives."

Reflecting on Mary's unquestioning obedience and her profound statement of trust, this week we ask:

How do you open you heart to what God wants for you?

In a letter from Bishop Knestout last week, he pointed out the heavy toll on innocent people that the war in Israel and the Gaza Strip has caused. He noted that the Catholic Near East Welfare Association and Pontifical Mission is on the ground in Jerusalem and Gaza supporting high priority emergency needs. He also asked that we take up a special collection for the organization next Sunday, December 31. Please support this worthy effort next Sunday.



#### **MASS INTENTIONS**

A Mass Intention is a specific offering in honor of, or in memory of someone by name at a specific mass time on a specific date that is traditionally offered as a gift to someone who is grieving a recent loss or celebrating a milestone.

What is a Mass Intention? Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics the Church provided for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention.

Any individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for various reasons, i.e., in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul.

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three aims in mind: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Therefore, the effects of the Mass bring certain benefits or fruits. The general fruits of the Mass are the effects upon the whole Church-to the living faithful as well as the poor souls in purgatory. For this reason, in the Canon of the Mass (the Eucharistic Prayer), a special mention is made for both the living and the dead. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass, i.e. "for whom this Mass is offered." The intention of the Mass is also determined by various factors: The Church may stipulate the particular intention, for example, all pastors are required to offer one Mass on Sunday for the intentions of the living and deceased parishioners of a parish.

A priest may also have his own particular intention in offering a Mass, such as the repose of the soul of his parents. Finally, a person may ask a priest to offer a Mass for a particular intention, in which case it is customary to give an offering of \$10 to the priest who is celebrating the Mass. In doing so, the faithful have the privilege of joining their own sacrifice to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, thereby obtaining an even greater abundance of spiritual fruit.
