

#### **ACTIVELY WAITING IN FAITHFULNESS**

Today's Gospel tells of the interaction of the Holy Family with two elderly people they encounter in the Temple in Jerusalem shortly after Jesus' birth.

Mary and Joseph present their newborn Child in the Temple, in obedience to the law, forty days after his birth, even though Jesus, the Son of God, is already "consecrated to the Lord," and Mary has no need of purification. Yet their humble and obedient fulfillment of the law enables us to see our salvation, and, like Simeon, to encounter our long-awaited consolation and redemption.

Saint Luke tells us that Simeon is directed to the Temple by the Spirit. Earlier, we are told, it had been revealed to Simeon that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord, and Simeon has been waiting for a very long time for Christ's arrival. When he takes the infant Jesus in his arms, he blesses God, and sings that the Lord's word has been fulfilled and that his own "eyes have seen your salvation which you prepared in sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel." (Luke 2:31-32)

While the story of the Presentation of The Lord has sometimes been called "Simeon's Encounter with Jesus," there is another prophet in the temple on that day with The Holy Family. Anna is over 80 years old and she is a widow. We know her father's name and her tribal lineage. We have none of her words. But we have her example of faithfulness, anticipating with prayer and fasting. When Anna comes into the Temple, she gives thanks to God and begins to evangelize about the beginning of the promised redemption of Jerusalem.

The Little Rock Scripture Study of the Gospel According to Luke includes this commentary:

If you have ever been promised something for which you had to wait a very long time, you might be able to appreciate the faithfulness of Simeon and Anna. It is not just their waiting that leads them to recognize that the child Jesus is the beginning of promises fulfilled. Simeon is a man of prayer who experiences the Spirit and finds in the Temple the sign he is told to expect. Anna is a prophetess, who reads the signs of the times and speaks for God. She spends her time in the Temple in prayer and fasting.

Both Simeon and Anna illustrate that waiting involves action and contemplative listening. They go to the place where their faith finds its home and they are people of prayer. They were not simply in the right place at the right time; they were in the right space spiritually and recognized the time of God's action.

Reflecting upon the examples of Simeon and Anna, this week we ask:

What specific actions can you take to improve your active waiting for the glory and goodness of God in your life?

# What is the Holy Family prayer?

HOLY FAMILY OF NAZARETH, make our family one with you. Help us to be instruments of peace. Grant that love, strengthened by grace, may prove mightier than all the weaknesses and trials through which our families sometimes pass.

# What is an example of a Holy Family?

The Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph, united in love for God and in obedience to God, supplies us with the perfect example of how to live and of the ideal family, united in God's love. No family formed in the likeness of the Holy Family will be in peril.

In that home at Nazareth we meet a couple who shows an openness to allowing God to lead their life together. Mary surely had other plans for her life; as many believe, she took a vow of virginity at an early age, so becoming a physical mother was something she did not anticipate. Yet, she heard God's invitation, and knew that His plans were better for her life; therefore, she gives her fiat — that is, her "yes" to God.

St. Joseph opens his heart to the messenger sent by God and takes Mary into his home. This would not be the first or last time that St. Joseph followed God's lead in his life as he protected the Holy Family. After Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, they follow the prompting of an angel to flee into Egypt for safety and wait there until another angelic message leads them back home. The Holy Family is a great example for families everywhere to always be open to whatever God's will might be and to always be listening for God to speak. He might speak his will in prayer or through another person. By our own prayer and discernment, we too can follow God's lead for our life.

#### The gospel of the family

To live the gospel of the family is not easy today. Those who want to defend life from the moment of conception are criticized or attacked. Yet in the Gospel we find the way to live a beautiful life on the personal and familial level, a way that is certainly challenging, but attractive and all-embracing. It is a way that still deserves to be trusted and undertaken after the example and through the intercession of the Holy Family of Nazareth itself. There are happy and sad, serene and difficult moments in every family. This is life. To live the "gospel of the family" does not exempt us from experiencing difficulties and tensions, of encountering moments of pleasant fortitude and painful weakness. Families who are wounded and marked by weakness, failure, difficulty...can rise again if they learn how to draw from the font of the Gospel. There, they can rediscover new possibilities of starting over.

Many of you know the ministry heads and observe the persons who each Sunday provide a visible presence of their Church and parish commitment. #### **MASS INTENTIONS**

A Mass Intention is a specific offering in honor of, or in memory of someone by name at a specific mass time on a specific date that is traditionally offered as a gift to someone who is grieving a recent loss or celebrating a milestone.

What is a Mass Intention? Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics the Church provided for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention.

Any individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for various reasons, i.e., in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul.

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three aims in mind: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Therefore, the effects of the Mass bring certain benefits or fruits. The general fruits of the Mass are the effects upon the whole Church-to the living faithful as well as the poor souls in purgatory. For this reason, in the Canon of the Mass (the Eucharistic Prayer), a special mention is made for both the living and the dead. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass, i.e. "for whom this Mass is offered." The intention of the Mass is also determined by various factors: The Church may stipulate the particular intention, for example, all pastors are required to offer one Mass on Sunday for the intentions of the living and deceased parishioners of a parish.

A priest may also have his own particular intention in offering a Mass, such as the repose of the soul of his parents. Finally, a person may ask a priest to offer a Mass for a particular intention, in which case it is customary to give an offering of \$10 to the priest who is celebrating the Mass. In doing so, the faithful have the privilege of joining their own sacrifice to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, thereby obtaining an even greater abundance of spiritual fruit.


