



2024 APPEAL

As mentioned in the announcement of the Lenten Season, the Annual Appeal's in-pew process will take place on February 18th & 25th during Mass. Your support of the Appeal will provide for 22 distinct ministries of our Catholic Church such as food and shelter for families, support young men as they study as they study to become future priests, faith formation for youth and young adults, and so much more.

We will have pledge cards and envelopes for your use if needed, or you can enroll using the OR code included below. Last year we benefitted from the Appeal in several ways. The Diocese returned to us 50% of the monies we donated because we are a mission church.

Additionally, we received grants from the Fuel and Hunger Fund for our Parish Pence program and the Home Mission Fund for the purchase of security cameras.

The appeal comes at a critical opportunity for us to empower the next generation, provide for those in need, and strengthen Catholic Communities.

Our Parish goal has increased by 13% this year and is \$8,120. We will provide you with updates as the campaign progresses.

WHAT IS ADORATION?

When Catholics say they are "going to Adoration," they are typically referring to Eucharistic Adoration. Which, in the most basic terms, is the worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass. The Eucharistic Host is displayed in a monstrance on the altar so that all can see and pray in the presence of Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that, "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory", respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628)

We can show our adoration to God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Adoration is the first Thursday of the month, 9:30-10:30am.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. The First Sunday of Lent will be February 18th.




