Take Home Lesson

Go Out Into The World

May 12, 2024

This week's lesson is adapted from scripture scholar Stephen Lampe's commentary from our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

As the Easter season winds down, the Gospel tradition faces a logistics problem: how to move from the appearances of the resurrected Lord to a Spirit-charged community engaged in mission. In order for a transformation to take place, two events must occur: Jesus' appearances must cease, and the community must be animated by the Spirit. The four Gospels deal with these two events in different ways. Regarding Jesus' departure, there are striking variations. In Matthew, Jesus commissions his disciples on mountain in Galilee, and promises to stay with them (Matthew 28:16-20). Mark's original Gospel text has no account, although Jesus' ascension is found in Mark's "Longer Ending" (Mark 16:1-20). John's Gospel records a final encounter in Galilee, but it refers to Jesus' return, not his departure (John 21:1-5). Finally, Luke concludes his Gospel (Luke 24:50-53) and begins the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 1:6-12) with two slightly different descriptions of Jesus' ascension from the outskirts of Jerusalem. Regarding the Spirit, Jesus imparts the Spirit at the Last Supper in John; Matthew and Mark imply Jesus' "Spirit" remains active among the eleven; and Luke provides the dramatic Pentecost descent of the Spirit in Acts of the Apostles. It is the first event, Jesus' definitive departure and its consequences, that we celebrate today.

Today's first reading includes Luke's second account, from Acts of the Apostles, of Jesus' ascension. Responding to the apostles' question about the restoration of the "kingdom of Israel," Jesus gradually moves from knowledge to mission. Knowledge, we read, is not given to them, and belongs only to the Father. Instead, they are empowered by the Spirit to give witness to Jesus in Jerusalem and beyond, "to the ends of the earth".

As Jesus departs from the disciples' sight, two men dressed in white appear. This recalls for us other appearances of heavenly beings, at the empty tomb and at the transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36). These men now question the disciples: "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" Here, we can draw parallels between Jesus' ascension and his transfiguration. The two men in white at the transfiguration were Moses and Elijah, who, according to tradition, were taken up into heaven to make way for their successors (Joshua and Elisha, respectively). Similarly, now that Jesus has ascended, his successors (the disciples) can be empowered through the Spirit for their mission to go out into the world to be Jesus' witnesses.

Our mission is a continuation of Christ's mission, which he left us to take up after his ascension. We all must be ready to articulate what Jesus has done for us, what he means to us, and why he is the answer to the world's problems.

What one thing can you do this week to continue Christ's mission in your community?

THE ASCESION OF THE LORD

The Ascension is the event, where Jesus arose into heaven, at the end of his time on earth. Jesus' time on earth began with his birth. It was interrupted for three days by His death on the Cross. During that time, He descended into the realm of the dead and preached the Gospel to the good people who died before Him. This allowed those good and holy souls—the righteous dead, as we call them—who accepted Christ as their Savior to proceed to heaven. On the third day after his death and burial, Jesus Christ was raised from the dead, an event we call the Resurrection. He spent the next 40 days preaching and preparing His disciples to perform the work of preaching and baptizing all people.

(Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11) It is said that by His death and Resurrection, Jesus opened the gates of heaven for all humanity. This is true, and His Ascension demonstrates this to us. It is His proof that those of us who believe in Him in faith and follow Him will also be raised on the last day, and enter into heaven.

From heaven, Jesus hears our prayers and intercedes for us with His Father.

We celebrate this on Ascension Sunday, which is celebrated forty days after Easter. Traditionally it is celebrated on a Thursday as a Holy Day of Obligation. The Church presently observes it on a Sunday to allow more of the faithful to attend Mass. It remains a Holy Day of Obligation, and the faithful are reminded that all Sundays are obligatory by default.

The Ascension should not be confused with Pentecost, which is celebrated 50 days after Easter. Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Christ, after His Ascension.

MAY'S BUSY SPIRITUAL AND SOCIAL SCHEDULE

May promises to be an extremely busy spiritual and social time for the parish. On Mother's Day, we will celebrate the Feast of the Ascension and Social Sunday. The next Sunday is Pentecost and the First Communion Celebration for five lovely recipients. On May 26th is the Most Holy Trinity and Pancake Breakfast time.

Finally, to close out the month, will be Corpus Christi weekend commencing with the Feast of the Visitation on May 31st. (See accompanying article).



FEAST OF THE VISITATION AND CORPUS CHRISTI WEEKEND

The Feast of the Visitation falls this year on Friday, May 31st and Corpus Christi Sunday follows two days later on June 2nd. We are planning to begin our weekend of celebration



with a daytime retreat on Friday which will include morning prayer and reflection, Mass at noon, followed by lunch and time for reflection and sharing after lunch. Please contact the office or John Weidner if you are planning to attend the retreat or would like additional information.



Our weekend of celebration will continue on Sunday, June 2, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). We are planning a short Eucharistic procession at the end of Mass and then all are encouraged to remain for a Spring picnic hosted by our Parish Life ministry.

PENTECOST SUNDAY

The Christian feast of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, (50 days after Easter Sunday) commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as describe in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31). In Christian Tradition, this event represents the birth of the early church.

As one the most important solemnities on the Church's calendars, it has a rich depth of meaning, but here is how Pope Benedict summarized it in 2012:

This Solemnity makes us remember and relive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and the other disciples gathered in prayer with the Virgin Mary in the Upper Room (cf. Acts 2:1-11). Jesus, risen and ascended into Heaven, sent his Spirit to the Church so that every Christian might participate in his own divine life and become his valid witness in t he world. The Holy Spirit, breaking into history,

defeats aridity, opens hearts to hope, stimulates and fosters in us an interior maturity in our relationship with God and with our neighbor.
