Take Home Lesson

May 19, 2024

Living in the Spirit

This week's lesson is adapted from scripture scholar Stephen Lampe's commentary from our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

Pentecost has rightly been called the birthday of the Church. The interaction between the resurrected Lord and the small band of early disciples was the focus of the Easter season. With Jesus' ascension into heaven, the small band was deprived of his physical presence, but they were assured that they would receive the gift of the Spirit, a gift that would inaugurate the next phase of salvation history. It is the birth of that next phase and the role of the Spirit that Pentecost commemorates.

Today's first reading from Acts of the Apostles sets mentions "the time for Pentecost was fulfilled." Although Pentecost began as an agricultural festival fifty days after Passover, Jews of Luke's time understood it as a covenant renewal ceremony celebrating the giving of Torah at Sinai.

Three physical phenomena in the first part of the reading - the sound of a driving wind, the appearance of tongues as of fire (seen only by those in the house), and the experience of spoken language - have striking parallels with the Sinai event (Exodus 19:16-19) when God gave the Law. God's theophany (appearance) in Exodus was marked by thunder, lightning/fire, clouds, a loud voice (noise), and wind and smoke. God's message was embodied in the voice/noise and the fire. Thus, in this "new Sinai" event at Pentecost, the disciples experience a theophany (noise/wind and flame/fire) as they are filled with the Holy Spirit. The theophany is experienced by the crowd (an ingathering of Jews from all the nations speaking different languages) through the noise, but especially through the transformation of the disciples. The crowd does not need to see the flames, because they experience the Spirit-infused disciples and their message, each in his own language. Jesus' earlier promise of the Spirit is fulfilled as the disciples speak of "the mighty acts of God," and the Spirit gives birth to the Church.

Father George Smiga, the author of our current The Holy Spirit in the Bible study commentary, writes that the image of fire that we associate with the Holy Spirit suggests warmth, light and burning. When we see things that are wrong in our family, in our church, or in our world, we decide that things need to change, and we need to act. That powerful force within us, moving us to do what is right, is the burning of the Holy Spirit's fire. The Holy Spirit comes to us as fire to warm us, enlighten us, and if necessary, even singe us, leading us forward and prompting us to share our own fire at the service of the world around us.

When have you felt filled with the Spirit and emboldened to act with courage?

PENTECOST SUNDAY

The Christian feast of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, (50 days after Easter Sunday) commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31). In Christian Tradition, this event represents the birth of the early church.

As one of the most important solemnities on the Church's calendar, it has a rich depth of meaning, but here is how Pope Benedict summarized it in 2012:

This Solemnity makes us remember and relive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and the other disciples gathered in prayer with the Virgin Mary in the Upper Room (cf. Acts 2:1-11). Jesus, risen and ascended into Heaven, sent his Spirit to

the Church so that every Christian might participate in his own divine life and become his valid witness in the world. The Holy Spirit, breaking into history, defeats aridity, opens hearts to hope, stimulates and fosters in us an interior maturity in our




relationship with God and with our neighbor.

NEXT SUNDAY IS THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

The most Holy Trinity is the central and most profound mystery of the Christian faith and life. While we human beings can grasp certain aspects of this ultimate truth about God, precisely as a mystery, a full understanding is beyond our limited human comprehension. Yet, this deep mystery of God's inner life and essence is also one of the most informative on that, reflecting on the Trinity can shed invaluable light on what it means to be a human person.

Throughout history and in cultures throughout the world people have, by reason alone and after much consideration, concluded that God exists. Yet, we would devote ourselves to study over several lifetimes and never come to the conclusion that God is a Trinity of person-one and yet three: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We know this truth and other divine mysteries in our human weakness only because the Lord has revealed them to us. And he has revealed this truth not as a matter of curious theological trivia disconnected from our everyday lives, but in order to share his divine life with us.

The mystery of the Blessed Trinity, as the mystery of God in himself, is "the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith" (CCC 235).

Since the earliest days-since before the Church was born at Pentecost-the Christian faith has been Trinitarian. When Jesus descended into the water at his baptism, for example, the bystanders hear the Father's voice and see the Holy Spirit descend as a dove (Matthew 3:16-17) Later, Jesus will instruct his followers to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). Likewise, Saint Paul offered blessings with a Trinitarian formula (2 Corinthians 13:13) and the blessings and prayers of the early Church reflect this faith I the Trinity.

The essential elements of this divine mystery are that we worship one God who is an eternal loving communion of three Persons-Father, Son and Holy Spirit-who are all equal in power, all co-eternal, and all divine. One divine nature, they differ only in that the Father is not the Son; the Son is not the Father; the Spirit is not the Son; the Spirit is not the Father. While this mystery of one and yet three might at first seem contradictory and irrational by human

reckoning, of we delve deeper, we will find, like

the other paradoxes of the faith, an amazing and

profoundly life-changing truth.






