Take Home Lesson

June 30, 2024

<u>Justice Is Undying</u>

This take home is based upon commentary from scripture scholar Stephen Lampe found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

Today's first reading comes from first part of the Book of Wisdom, which focuses on righteousness and immortality. The first verse in Wisdom calls the reader to love righteousness and joins it with the assertion in today's reading that "justice is undying." In this passage, the term "justice" reflects the biblical sense of the word - that is, being in right relationship with God and engaging in right behavior toward others. Therefore, it should not be confused with the contemporary judicial term "justice," which can confuse our understanding of the passage.

Working toward the conclusion, then, that right relationship with God is "undying," the reading contrasts death with life. God and the right relationship with God are firmly placed on the side of life, drawing a lesson from Genesis' account of creation, in which God created us in his image. Still, although God is firmly grounded on the side of life, and his creation is always made for good, the final verses acknowledge that death is possible and that evil still lurks in our world. Alluding to the story of the Fall in Genesis 3, Wisdom notes that Adam and Eve's human sin facilitated the entry of death into the world through "the envy of the devil." This envy, and the death it leads to, stands in stark contrast to God's intention for humankind: to exist, to have a wholesome and imperishable nature, and to be made in God's image. In other words, God created human beings for eternal righteousness.


In last week's Gospel, Jesus demonstrated his divine power over the forces of nature as he calmed the stormy seas. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus heals two people on the edge of death. His actions point to the divine power of life over death. While Jesus' healing power is essential in each account, the faith of the woman and of Jairus is a key theological point. Jesus does what is asked, whether for oneself or for another.


God's power stands on the side of life and rescues the vulnerable from death. Undying justice is being in right relationship with God and engaging in right behavior toward others. To be unselfish and thoughtful of those among us who are most vulnerable would be right behavior.

Can you pray this week for a vulnerable person in need of the healing power of the Lord?

Have you noticed the new vestments that Father Koo has been wearing recently? The Knights of Columbus donated the money to purchase them. We thank the Knights for their generosity.








STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

FR. JOHN BODDIE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND REPORT

Since July 1, 2023, the Fr. John Boddie Memorial Scholarship Fund has provided

\$5,000 in scholarships, a \$5,000 grant to St Noa School, \$894.33 in Parish Education expenses and \$1,150 to cover the cost of printing the ads in the bulletin and administrative expenses. \$7,080.00 was donated the scholarship fund in the 2023 fund drive.
