

Take Home

Sunday, July 7, 2024

SELF ACCEPTANCE

In last week's Gospel, Jesus healed the woman suffering from hemmorage and revived Jabirus's daughter. Both healings are possible because of the faith of the woman and the faith of Jairus. They know that Jesus will do what they ask, and he does.

In today's second reading, Saint Paul tells us that he has asked the Lord three times to relieve him of a "thorn in the flesh" that has tormented him. This thorn could be a sickness or physical disability, a temptation, or a handicap connected with Paul's apostolic activity. Pauls could also be referring to some especially persistent or obnoxious opponent.

Three times he begged the Lord about this. His prayer was insistent, like that of Jesus at Gethsemane. Rather than relieve Paul of his suffering, the Lord tells Paul: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Cor 12:8)

Some people endure tremendous and persistent suffering. They pray for relief. The suffering persists. They may feel that God does not hear their prayers. But he does, and he will answer.

The catechism addresses this:

The Holy Spirit gives to some a special charism of healing so as to make manifest the power of the grace of the risen Lord. But even the most intense prayers do not always obtain the healing of all illnesses. Thus Saint Paul must learn from the Lord that "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness," and that the sufferings to be endured can mean that "in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his Body, that is, the Church." (CCC 1508)

So, Paul will gladly boast of his weaknesses "in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me."

Paul recognizes that the thorn he is dealing with was given to him by God. By turning his attention away from himself and toward God, he becomes content with weaknesses, insults and hardships, all for the sake of Christ, "for when I am weak, then I am strong."

God's grace is a gift given freely, and it is sufficient not just for Paul, but for all of us. We should use God's grace to transfigure not only our gifts of mind, heart, life and love but also to transfigure our weaknesses and feelings of inadequacy. We should give to Christ all that is in us, both strengths and weaknesses, so that he might do with them as he pleases.

What unavoidable weakness in yourself do you struggle to accept?


ATTENTION TO DETAIL




