

This take home is based upon commentary from scripture scholar Stephen Lampe found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

In last week's Gospel reading, Jesus returned to Nazareth, where he was rejected by his unbelieving fellow townsfolk. While such disbelief did not diminish Jesus' power to heal, it did limit the scope of his healing and teaching.

In today's Gospel, having already chosen the twelve and given them the secret of the kingdom of God, Jesus sends them out, warning them that in some places they too will experience a lack of welcome and that some will refuse to hear the message of repentance.

The twelve are to take nothing on their journey - no food, no sack, no money. Forgoing provisions takes faith. They must rely solely on hospitality, and God's support, for their mission. Regarding the hospitality they are to rely upon, Jesus also tells them to stay put in the first house that welcomes them. Remaining in the same house as a guest rather than moving to another offering greater comfort avoided the impression of seeking advantage for oneself and prevented dishonor to one's host. The gifts on offer are freely given and are not available to the highest bidder.

The twelve receive "authority over unclean spirits," they teach repentance, and they are advised that some places will not welcome them or listen to their message. Strikingly, although the mystery of the kingdom of God had been revealed to them earlier, they are not explicitly charged with preaching the kingdom. Rather, like Jesus himself, they give concrete witness to the kingdom through their actions, miracles, and messages that follow from acceptance and belief.


In a last bit of instruction, Jesus has some very strong words for those who refuse to listen to His Gospel. "Shaking off the dust" was a highly symbolic and provocative act in the ancient world. Pious Jews when leaving a Gentile land would shake off the dust of a Gentile town when leaving to show their separation from Gentile practices. Jesus's message, then, is something like: "You have heard the Gospel and refused it. You are in great danger of being condemned." Jesus is warning of being separated from Him, like useless dust.

"Shaking the dust off" is still good advice. We should not let rejection mitigate our zeal for our faith. We do not hear today of any towns rejecting the disciples. Rather, we hear that they drove out many demons and cured the sick.

The Parish Year of Eucharistic Revival comes to a close next week as thousands of Catholics gather in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress. The bishops of the United States have designed the conclusion of the Congress as a spiritual sending forth of not just the attendees but for the entire Body of Christ, to spread the good news and challenge our neighbors to "repent and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15)




