



The prophet Jeremiah was a theological commentator on the final years of the kingdom of Judah, including the destruction of Jerusalem by Babylon in 587 BC, and the deportation of its people into exile in Babylon. Jeremiah mercilessly condemned the failed leadership of the monarchy, even as he offered hints of hope. Today's reading is part of a larger indictment of the "shepherds' (the kings of Judah/Davidic monarchy), accusing them of destroying and scattering the "flock" (the people of Judah). In caring only for themselves and their well-being, the kings have roused God to punish their wicked ways.

This pitiable situation leads to some unexpected consequences. First, the Lord himself, and no human agent, will bring the flock back from exile to their meadow. Only after this gathering will new shepherds (that is, restored Davidic kings) be raised up. Second, Jeremiah gives voice to the exiles' hope that a righteous shoot will emerge. This hope is ironic since the last Davidic king's name, Zedekiah, means "righteous" but he was not. The hope is that the shoot will bear the name "The LORD is our justice," and will embody the reality of that name, doing just and righteous acts.

This shepherd imagery from the Old Testament links to today's Gospel. Last week we heard of the mission of the twelve apostles. Today's Gospel begins with the return of the apostles, who have performed powerful deeds of exorcism and healing. Jesus recognizes his friends are in need of rest and a good meal after their journeys, so he draws them to a deserted place. There will be no rest for the weary since a vast crowd has already arrived at the "deserted" place before Jesus and his friends.

Jesus' pity at the site of the large crowd that followed them comes from his awareness that they are "like sheep without a shepherd". While Jesus does not claim the title "Shepherd" here, his compassion clearly links him to shepherd imagery as in today's first reading where God cares for the sheep of his flock who have been led astray by mortal shepherd-kings.

For us in the present day, we sometimes try to get away from the coming and going of people around us. We may wish to withdraw to a quiet place for rest and recharging. And at just that time, family or friends or neighbors, like sheep without a shepherd, will ask for our attention.

Will you be able to respond with compassion when those in need gather around you?




