Take Home Lesson

August 4, 2024

The Eyes of Faith

This take home is drawn from commentary by scripture scholar Eric J. Wagner found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

During this liturgical year (Year B of the lectionary cycle), the Gospel according to Mark is typically proclaimed. Last Sunday, however, we began hearing from the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, a section which is often called the "Bread of Life Discourse." We will hear this discourse through the rest of the Sundays in August and, in doing so, we have the opportunity to explore in greater depth the mystery hidden in the food that the Lord provides.

Two weeks ago, we heard that Jesus' disciples returned from their missionary work, excited but exhausted. Jesus attempts to have them withdraw to a deserted place so they can have rest, but the crowds follow. Jesus pities the crowd because "they were like sheep without a shepherd" (Mark 6:34). Then, last Sunday, we heard the story of Jesus miraculously feeding the crowds with five loaves and a couple of fish. In the account from John's Gospel, the crowd interprets the feeding as an indicator that they should make Jesus their king. But Jesus withdraws to the mountain alone, which is reminiscent of Moses communing with God at Sinai.

Today, Jesus enters into conversation with the crowd that had been miraculously fed. The crowd honors him by calling him "Rabbi" but Jesus takes control of the conversation and explains that they are seeking him for a superficial reason: they were hungry and he fed them. By the thinking of ancient times, feeding the people is a duty that falls to the king.

Jesus next points to food "that endures for eternal life". The crowd begins to catch the connection to stories from earlier salvation history and turns to Moses and the manna provided in the desert, which we read in today's first reading. That story matches Jesus feeding the multitude in a deserted place. Perhaps Jesus might be a new Moses? They want Jesus to perform a sign, as Moses did when the people were enslaved in Egypt.

So they said to Jesus, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe you? What can you do?" (John 6:30) This crowd may be overlooking the miraculous feeding provided by Jesus, and they are beginning to follow Jesus' logic, but Jesus wants to look deeper. He points out that Moses was not the one who actually provided the food or worked wonders in Egypt. He was only as instrument of God, the heavenly Father of Jesus.

The crowd seems to understand, and they beg Jesus for the everlasting bread of the Father. The Gospel reading ends with Jesus telling the crowd, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." The crowd is left wanting a sign from God, which is where we will pick up the discourse next Sunday. Some will come to believe, others will fail to see the sign that is Jesus, the Incarnate God.

When has your faith helped you believe without "seeing signs" from God?

The Fr, John Boddie Memorial Scholarship Fund drive started last Sunday. Our goal this year is to raise \$10,000. During the




2023-2024 year the Scholarship Committee awarded over \$12,000 in scholarship and grants. The ads in the bulletin are our only source of funding.


