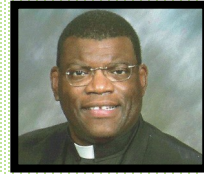

ASSUMPTION

Next Thursday, August 15, we observe the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary as a holy day of obligation. Daily Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 A.M. at Church of the Visitation and at 6:30 P.M. at Francis de Sales in Mathews.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven reveals that what God begins, he brings to completion. In predestining her to be the Mother of the Savior, the Lord prepared her through the Immaculate Conception, which preserved her from original sin. Grace continued to expand and flower in her, giving her strength to stand by Jesus on the cross. She was preserved from the corruption of the tomb and enjoys already a bodily participation in the glory of Christ in heaven. From there, she prays for us - that grace may come to perfection in us, and that we may share in her glory with Jesus.

Bishop Robert Barron reflects upon the Fourth Glorious Mystery of The Rosary, The Assumption, as follows:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, quoting Lumen Gentium, teaches that "The Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory." (CCC 966) In other words, Mary is the first participant in the fullness of Christ's Resurrection.

In her great Magnificat, Mary is the new Isaiah, the new Jeremiah, the new Ezekiel, for she announces with greatest clarity and joy the coming of the Messiah. What was only vaguely foreseen in those great prophetic figures is now in clear focus: "He has shown the strength of his arm; he has battered the proud in their conceit; he has filled the hungry with good things and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel, for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever." (Luke 1:51-55) There is nothing stronger or more beautiful in any of the prophets.

But Mary is more than strong and beautiful; she is the sinless one, the perfect disciple. Mary, who exists now in this other world, is not so much somewhere else as somehow else, and this helps explain why we can speak of her, especially in her heavenly state, as interceding and praying for us.

Let us contemplate Mary's critical role in salvation history, culminating in her bodily Assumption, which, like the Ascension of Jesus, draws us toward a higher world.



Take Home Lesson

LIFE FOR THE WORLD

Sunday, August 11, 2024

This take home lesson is drawn from commentary by scripture scholar Eric J. Wagner found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

In today's first reading, Elijah's courage and resolve have given way to fear and he begs God for death. The Lord of Life will have none of it. Twice God sends a messenger, an angel, with bread, water and a message: "Get up and eat." This message will echo Christ's repeated mandate to those whom he raises from illness and death. Strengthened by God, Elijah continues his journey through the wilderness. This account of God's chosen one languishing in the desert prepares us for Jesus' message today in the Gospel.

As we continue to hear the Bread of Life Discourse, concerns emerge among Jesus' audience. This Jewish community knows Jesus. They know his family. They know he is not someone important, not a man of high status. He is just another Galilean Jew like them. Yet they heard him refer to himself as the bread of life and say that he is food and drink that, once consumed, will remove all hunger and thirst forever. He has called himself heavenly bread, and he didn't mean it metaphorically. Their murmuring recalls the complaints of the chosen people during their initial wanderings in the wilderness, complaints heard in the first reading last Sunday. Here, as in the wilderness and when Elijah sat parched under a shade tree, the Lord shows compassion on the people. He grasps and understands their concerns.

Responding to their complaints, Jesus continues teaching his audience by appealing repeatedly to Scripture. He freely recites Isaiah 54:13 to remind them that the prophetic tradition promised that God would attract and teach all people. Thus, they are drawn to his words for a reason. Then, reaching further back into Jewish history, he points to the story of manna in the wilderness. In that situation, food was a temporary solution to the people's concern. However, in Jesus, the soul-deep hunger and parched spirit that the whole human community knows meets satisfaction. Anticipated in the angelic bread that nourished Elijah for a protracted desert journey (40 days), Jesus sustains the weary. He satisfies the murmuring. He is the bread of life.

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." "Flesh" points us to the Eucharist but also reminds us of the truth of Jesus' nature, that he is both divine and human.

When has the bread of life given you the strength you needed to face a difficult situation in your life?
