Take Home Lesson

CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE

August 25, 2024

This take home lesson is drawn from commentary by scripture scholar Eric J. Wagner found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

In today's first reading concerning the deep, mysterious relationship between Christ and the Church, Saint Paul appeals in his letter to the Ephesians to the most fundamental, intimate human relationship - marriage - to explain the bond between Christ and the Church. Using the model of household codes, which served as a paradigm for organizing ancient Greco-Roman households, Ephesians transforms the language of those codes to talk about the relationship of Christ and the Church as a household built on mutual love and service. While contemporary readers might focus on elements of inequity in this passage from Ephesians, it aims to highlight the mutual service that is part and parcel of the most robust spousal relationships. Like a husband willing to die for his bride, Christ sanctifies the Church by offering himself. As a husband might wash his wife and clothe her in fine attire with the utmost affection, so Christ speaks his cleansing word to his bride, the Church, with the greatest affection. Moreover, Christ sanctifies the Church by wrapping her in the spotless and wrinkle-free "garment" of his loving word.

Building on this imagery, Saint Paul claims that everyone, fundamentally, cherishes and cares for their own flesh. Presumably all readers understand and live by this principle, which, in many respects, remain in force today. We see to our basic physical needs by obtaining food, clothing and shelter. But Saint Paul extends the claim. The care we provide in obtaining our own basic needs is to be applied to spouses. Love of one's spouse is to be considered tantamount to caring for one's own body. There should be no conceptual distinction between caring for oneself and caring for one's spouse. Such selfless care and mutual giving between spouses typify Christ's giving of himself for and to the Church. As such, the relationship between Christ and the Church provides the paradigm of the Christian household, wherein mutual subordination to the needs of the other should reign.

This is a great mystery, regarding Christ and his Church. Jesus is subordinate to the Church in that he gave everything for his beloved the Church. He gives himself completely in his suffering and death so that his bride, the Church, might be made holy and share in his life.

Christ humbled himself, became human, to be joined to us so that we could be joined to him. Christ's self-sacrificing love should be made manifest in marriage relationships. We can better embody this when we enter into the mystery of Christ's paschal love.

In what way has the example of Christian marriage (either your own or that of another couple) helped you understand the relationship between Christ and his church?


