



This take home lesson is drawn from commentary by scripture scholar Eric J. Wagner found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

When James scolds "rich people" in today's second reading, it can be tempting to think that his audience is a wayward group of Christians who have become overly interested in acquiring wealth through fraudulent means. But this approach misses the more likely reality that James' audience consisted mostly of poor individuals whose livelihoods would have been threatened by wealthy figures ready to cheat them out of wages. Moreover, since James' audience was early Christians who understood themselves to be united with Christ in their dealings with unjust employers, they probably associated with the righteous one who was condemned and murdered by the "rich people." Accordingly, James' reprimand and condemnation is best understood as a prophetic oracle aimed at figures who, if not enemies, were at least hostile toward the early Christian community.

James' message for such an audience would have been deeply consoling. He would have been seen as a prophet who spoke (and wrote) boldly against economic inequality and injustice. What is more, through his words, the Christian community could have confidence that all who oppressed the Lord's flock through fraudulent acquisitions and covetous holding of wealth would receive their comeuppance from God. And so it is that prophetic messages like that of James indicated that the prophetic spirit, which first rested on Moses and the seventy elders, was coming to rest on the Christian community. As in the days of old, God was at work amid his people strengthening them for their sojourn in a new wilderness of oppression.

Wealth, monetary or otherwise, can be fleeting and can negatively impact others depending on the way it is gained or used. James specifically speaks of the impact greed has on others: "Behold, the wages you withheld from the workers who harvested your fields are crying aloud; and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts." (James 5:4)

Thinking beyond monetary wealth, this week we ask:

Is there something that you are rich in that might be having a negative impact on your relationship with God?


