

Take Home Lesson

## Danger of Riches

This take home lesson is drawn from commentary by scripture scholar Eric J. Wagner found in our Workbook for Lectors, Gospel Readers and Proclaimers of the Word.

In today's Gospel, when an ardent student throws himself at Jesus in an attempt to obtain eternal life, he shows himself to be knowledgeable of the law and an avid follower of it. As Jesus recites various commandments governing murder, adultery, theft, perjury, fraud, and parental honor, the man confidently professes to have followed God's commands on all these matters from his youth. Thus, we sense from the man's passionate behavior - running up to Jesus, kneeling down before him, honoring him with the title "Good Teacher" - and his habit of legal obedience that this man will stop at nothing to obtain eternal life. He is more than a student of God's will. He is doing God's will. So, based on his behavior and his testimony, we anticipate that whatever Jesus might demand of him, he will do. But something else happens. When Jesus looks at the man, loves him, and invites him to sell all his possessions, give the money to the poor, and then follow Jesus on his journey, the man becomes somber and departs in sorrow. He abandons his quest for eternal life on account of having many possessions.

In the context of the Bible's wisdom tradition, which the first two readings highlight, Jesus' teaching on possessions can be difficult to grasp. In this tradition, wisdom is something this man has likely acquired through his commitment to the law. Moreover, such wisdom was not at odds with wealth. In fact, as the first reading suggests, wisdom gives rise to wealth. So, the man's possessions may well have indicated his vast wisdom. And, with such wisdom, he would already have made significant advances on the path to eternal life. Thus, when the Lord claims that it is hard for the rich to enter the kingdom go God, the man and Jesus' disciples are baffled. If not the rich, then who?

Today's first reading reminds us that wisdom is, first of all, a gift. Jesus reminds his disciples that salvation too is a gift. Entry into God's kingdom can be sought, but it is ultimately unearned. Instead, it is freely given by God.

Jesus said, "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." (Mark 10:25)

How can the pleasures and comforts of this word become barriers to your relationship with God?

Early in person voting has began 9/20 10/15 - Last Day To Register to Vote 11/5 - Election Day




