

Journey Through The Bible

Sunday, December 8, 2024

Two weeks ago, at the end of the Take Home Lesson published in this space, we asked this question: In the new liturgical year, what will you be doing to deepen your understanding and love of Christ the King?

Last week, we asked: What habit of prayer could you strengthen during this Advent season and in the coming vear?

These two questions align with plans our pastor has been discussing for several weeks to strengthen our faith formation efforts in the coming year. Specifically, and as announced after Mass last Sunday, Father Koo invites everyone in the parish to join him on a year long "Journey through the Bible" in 2025.

Starting on January 1st, our objective is to read through and present instruction on every book of the Bible over the course of 2025.

We plan to use "The Bible in a Year" daily reading plan that covers the entire Catholic Bible in 365 days. Most days we will be reading two or three chapters from two different books, as well as a Psalm or a few verses from Proverbs.

It takes somewhere between 54 and 72 hours to read the entire Bible, which works out to less than 15 minutes per day.

Our reading plan is the same plan used by Father Mike Schmitz for his "The Bible in a Year" podcast. A PDF file of the reading plan is attached to the email with this week's bulletin.

We are also planning to offer presentations each month and we will be encouraging informal small group discussions as part of our Journey. Father Koo mentioned after Mass last week that we are still working out details and we may be able to host guest speakers for some of these presentations.

Father Koo is strongly encouraging everyone in the parish to join him on the journey. While no one is obligated to participate, the benefits of engaging in daily prayer and reading of scripture as a faith community are beyond measure.

Father quoted Saint Jerome last week, who wrote: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!" This sharp statement on the necessity for each Christian to have direct, personal knowledge of the inspired books of the Holy Bible comes in a commentary on Isaiah. Saint Jerome's conviction about the need to know Scriptures anticipated the insight of Saint Augustine that in the Old Testament the New is concealed, and in the New the Old is revealed. Our Adult Bible Study group has just completed a twelve lesson study of Isaiah, and our group will testify to the truth of Saint Augustine's insight.

As we embark on our reading of the Bible in the coming year, this space in the bulletin will shift from Take Home Lessons that are typically about the Sunday readings to instruction and commentary about upcoming or just completed readings from our Journey Through the Bible. In next week's bulletin, look for an answer to this question: How many books are included in the Catholic Bible?

THE SEASON OF ADVENT

General Background on the Season

Advent has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by the First coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reason, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight

(Universal Norms of the Liturgical Year.)

With the beginning of Advent is, too the beginning of the new liturgical year (2025), and year C of the three Liturgical years.

The use of the advent wreath has become popular practice in the church. The concept of the Advent wreath originated among German Lutherans in the 16th Century. However, it was not until three centuries later that the modern Advent wreath took shape. The modern Advent wreath, with its candles representing the Sundays of Advent, originated from an 1839 initiative by Johann Hinrich Wichern, a Protestant pastor in Germany and a pioneer in urban mission work among the poor.

THE FOUR ADVENT CANDLES

As a Christian tradition, the wreath hold the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ candle."

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey Joseph and Mary took from Nazareth to Bethlehem.


