

## Journey Through the Bible: Patriarchs and Matriarchs of God's People (Genesis, Chapters 25-35)

This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study's "Panorama of the Old Testament."

The accounts of Genesis 25-35 narrate the stories of the descendants of Abraham and Sarah. We see that God's promises are reaffirmed to their son and grandson, so that God comes to be referred to as "the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob." But these stories are filled not only with promises confirmed, but also with bitter family relationships. It is not Abraham's first son, Esau, who inherits the promises, but Isaac, conceived in Sarah's old age by the saving will of God. Isaac's wife Rebekah delivers twin sons, first Esau, then Jacob follows, gripping Esau's heel and prefiguring a life of conflict between the two sons.

As the boys mature, Jacob uses his cleverness to claim the inheritance that is due to Esau. Over and over Israel's stories demonstrate that God's promises cannot be merited or taken for granted. They do not belong by right to the nature or most obvious successor; rather, they are the free gift of God.

While Jacob is fleeing an enraged Esau, God meets with Jacob through a dream at Bethel. Jacob dreams of angels traveling up and down a stairway that stretches between earth and heaven. God stand s beside Jacob, identifies himself, and reaffirms to Jacob the promises made to the family of Abraham: the land on which Jacob is lying, numerous descendants, and a blessing to all the families of the earth. God concludes in this way:

"I am with you and will protect you wherever you go, and bring you back to this land. I will never leave you until I have done what I promised you." (Genesis 28-15)

After taking both Leah and Rachel as his wives and giving fourteen years of service to their cunning father, Jacob prepares to return to his own land with his two wives, two maidservants, and eleven children. He learns his brother Esau is coming to meet him after many years of estrangement. Jacob fears that his brother Esau will take revenger for his deception. But on the night before they meet, Jacob encounters a divine visitor and they wrestle throughout the night. When Jacob asks the stranger for a blessing, God changes Jacob's name to Israel, which means "he who wrestles with God." So Jacob becomes the father of the nation that will be formed from the tribes of his sons, a nation that will certainly wrestle with God throughout its history.

At dawn Esau arrives and runs to his brother, weeping and embracing him. Jacob's happy surprise teaches him to trust in God's designs. He does not need to scheme and decide to obtain God's blessings. Jacob experiences the divine presence in both the love of God and the love of his brother. Here there is hope that forgiveness and reconciliation can prevail over the homicidal jealously exemplified in Cain and Abel.



# QCD'S & ON-LINE E-GIVING

This is the time of year to consider making donations to the church with a Qualified Charitable Deduction (QCD).

For parishioners that take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) this is a way to save on taxes. Income from RMD's is considered income and you pay taxes on that amount. A QCD donation is protected and deducted from your gross income for tax purposes.

The one qualifier is the donation must come directly from your IRA, thus necessitating contacting your investment broker to make the transfer directly to COV. Please consider this option for your donation this year.

Additionally, COV provides an E-giving option on their website www.church-of-the-visitation.org. This allows you to make donations by credit card, checking account, quarterly, monthly, weekly, bi-weekly. Special onetime donations can also be made on this site.


# THANKS



At the end of December our parish pence fund helped an elderly couple with heating oil for their house.




