

This commentary is adapted from the study guide entitled Panorama of the Old Testament and from The Collegeville Bible Commentary, both published by Little Rock Scripture Study.

The Book of Genesis opens with a highly structured, hymn like account of creation by the Priestly author. Most scripture scholars recognize four authors/sources for the Pentateuch, the first five books of the Bible: Priestly, Yahwist, Elohist, and Deuteronomic.

The Priestly account of creation is a theological reflection on the world that the author has experienced. God is seen as a powerful Being, able to create by merely speaking a word. The world in which humanity lives has been organized by God, but as God's representative on earth, humanity is to be sovereign over the world.

Some of the essential truths taught by the creation account of Genesis 1 are these:

There is one supreme God, unlike the multiple gods of other nations. God is the primary cause of all that exists. The sun and moon are not gods, as other religions believed, but part of God's creation. All creation is good, and people are the peak of that good creation. Men and women are equally made in the image of a loving God. Men and women are co-creators with God and stewards of the earth

The Yahwist account of creation is much more local in scope than the Priestly account; it is concerned with the human relationship to the soil and the relationship between man and woman, not the creation of the universe. Clearly drawn for an agricultural background, the story presents humanity as coming from the ground, and dependent on the ground for life.

Some of the essential truths taught by the account of Adam and Eve in the second creation account are these:

Human beings are created by God with the ability to choose or reject God's will. The root cause of human suffering is sin, the human choice to disobey God. Sin disrupts human relationship sand brings about shame and blame. Suffering is not a punishment inflicted by God, but a consequence of sin. Human beings suffer on account of our own sin and the sins of others. God doesn't abandon the human race but promises them a future in which to hope.

The very first sentence in the New American Bible Revised Edition of the Book of Genesis reads "with darkness over the abyss and a mighty wind sweeping over the waters" The Hebrew word "ruach", is used to describe a movement of air and it can be translated as wind, breath or spirit. So, that same first sentence in the Revised Standard Version is translated to read "and darkness was upon the face of the deep; and the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters"

Both translations are correct. Do you have a preference?

EPIPHANY

While the hustle and bustle of Christmas ends for many people on Dec. 26th, throughout Christian history Christmas lasts for twelve days – all the way until Jan. 6th. This feast marking the end of Christmas is called "Epiphany."

In the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, Epiphany celebrates the revelation that Jesus was the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Three Wise Men, but also in his baptism in the Jordan and at the wedding at Cana.

In the Eastern rites of the Catholic Church, Theophany – as Epiphany is known in the East – commemorates the manifestation of Jesus' divinity at his Baptism in the River Jordan. While the traditional date for the feast is Jan. 6th, in the United States the celebration of Epiphany is moved to the Sunday between Jan. 2 and Jan. 8th.



Origins of Epiphany

While the Western celebration of Epiphany (which comes from Greek, meaning "revelation from above"), and the Eastern celebration of Theophany (meaning "revelation of God"), have developed their own traditions and liturgical significances, these feasts share more than the same day. "The Feast of Epiphany, or the Feast of Theophany, is a very, very early feast," said Fr. Carnazzo. "It predates the celebration of Christmas on the 25th." While the Western celebration of Epiphany (which comes from Greek, meaning "revelation from above"), and the Eastern celebration of Theophany (meaning "revelation of God"), have developed their own traditions and liturgical significances, these feasts share more than the same day.

Over time, the Western Church separated the remaining feasts into their own celebrations, leaving the celebration of the Epiphany to commemorate primarily the Visitation of the Magi to see the newborn Christ on Jan. 6th.
