LEGACY

One of the simplest ways to leave a gift to our church is to use the beneficiary designation on savings and retirement accounts, as well as life insurance policies. These can be done with no cost, and typically only require us to sign a new beneficiary designation form.



Retirement assets and similar accounts are called Income in Respect of a Decedent (IRD) assets. This is taxable income that's earned during life but not received before death, so it is never included in an income tax return. This may be assets in Individual Retirement Accounts or 403(b) plans, accrued interest on Certificates of Deposit and savings bonds, nonqualified stock options, deferred payments of capital gains, or other income that is earned but not acquired.

In most cases, naming the church as the beneficiary of these types of assets gives the estate and heirs the best tax benefits, since it avoids both income and estate taxes.



Journey Through the Bible: The Joseph Story (Genesis, Chapters 37-50)

This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study's "Panorama of the Old Testament."

Jacob's two wives, Rachel and Leah, together with their maidservants, have among them twelve sons: Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar, Zebulun, Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher, Joseph, and Benjamin. These twelve become the patriarchs from whom the twelve tribes of Israel take their descent.

The last section of Genesis, chapters 37-50, contains the stories of Joseph and his relationship to his brothers. Joseph, the first son of Rachel, is Jacob's spoiled and favorite son. His father loves him best and made him a long ornamented tunic. Joseph's dreams and his ability to interpret them intensify his brothers' jealously. Rather than kill him, the brothers sell Joseph to traders going to Egypt and tell Jacob his favorite son has been killed by a wild beast. Jacob is deceived by his sons just as he deceived his own father Isaac to obtain his blessing.

In Egypt, Joseph successfully interprets the dreams of Pharaoh and thereby saves Egypt from famine. When Joseph is made a favorite minister of Pharaoh, famine in Canaan brings his brothers to seek help from Egypt. Joseph is now in a position to invite his father and brothers to come down to Egypt to live and escape the famine. Joseph's reunion with his brothers is an emotional event and their father Jacob dies a happy man because he is reunited with his son Joseph.

The account of Joseph reads like a novel. It is a story of injury and forgiveness, of estrangement and reconciliation. We see the development of Joseph from a selfish alienated youth to a mature and selfless leader fully reconciled with his family. Through his generosity and willingness to forgive, Joseph upholds the unity of Israel's family and prevents their extinction. Through all these accounts, the providential hand of God guides the fate of the family of Jacob-Israel as God brings good out of evil and turn disaster into triumph over and over again.

In the Book of Genesis we have moved from the moment of creation through a history of sin to the call of Abraham, of Isaac, of Jacob, and finally to Joseph and the tribes in Egypt. In these stories we have learned of God's relationship to the world and to Israel. We have learned of God as creator, as judge, as redeemer. We have met a God who accepts the weakness of humanity and continues to love, a God who guides and directs, a God who is able to bring good out of evil. Genesis is only the beginning of the story, the beginning of the acts of God. The story continues not only through the Old and New Testaments but in our own lives and our world.


ENVELOPES, CALENDARS, AND TAX STATEMENTS

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The Catholic Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a celebration of Jesus being presented in the Temple as a child and Mary's purification. It is celebrated on February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

What is celebrated?

The Presentation of Jesus: Jesus is presented in the Temple by his parents, Mary & Joseph, in accordance with the Mosaic Law. Purification of Mary: Mary is purified 40 days after giving birth, as required by the Mosaic Law.

What is the significance?

The feast celebrates the meeting of the Old and New Testaments. The feast is a reminder that Jesus is the "light to the gentiles". The feast gives hope and motivation to keep moving forward in life.

How is it celebrated?

The feast is celebrated with the blessing of candles. The feast is also known as Candlemas.

February 2: Presentation of the Lord-Feast

As faithful Jews who obeyed the Law of Moses, Mary and Joseph performed two ritual acts that the law prescribed after the birth of the firstborn son—Mary's ritual purification and Jesus' dedication. The Presentation of the Lord is celebrated forty days after Christmas, marking the day that Mary and Joseph would have brought Jesus into the Temple. Though Mary was pure and free from sin from the moment of her conception, and though the Son of God did not need to be redeemed, Mary and Joseph fulfilled these ritual obligations.

At the heart of this celebration is the encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. Simeon was the first to understand and proclaim Jesus as the Savior of the World. He also prophesied that this salvation would be accomplished by a sword of sorrow that would pierce Mary's Immaculate Heart. Anna, a prophetess, also came forward and "gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem" (Luke 2:38). In the ritual acts in the Temple, Jesus' divine mission was made manifest to the world.

We are invited to participate in Mary's ritual purification and Jesus' ritual redemption. Each of us is unworthy of entering the true Temple of the Lord in Heaven, yet we are invited to do so in union with Mary, our Blessed Mother. It was her consent to God's will that opened the door of God's grace to us all. By allowing Jesus to be born in our hearts by grace, we spiritually become Jesus' "mother." With her, we are now able to appear before God, purified and holy in His sight.
