You are able to deduct the full value, avoid the capital gain tax and make a substantial gift to the parish. A good steward uses his or her assets in a way that does the most good.

Giving appreciated stock you have held for more than a year is better than giving cash. If you donate stock that has increased in value since you bought it more than a year ago - and if you itemize deductions - you can take a charitable deduction for the stock's fair market value on the day you give it away. Journey Through the Bible: Entering into the Land of God's Promise (Joshua 1-24)

This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study's "Panorama of the Old Testament."

The books of Joshua, Judges, 1 and 2 Samuel, and 1 and 2 Kings are sometimes referred to as the Deuteronomistic history. They cover over 600 years of history, beginning with the death of Moses to the destruction of Jerusalem in 587 BC. Together these books demonstrate the results of that fundamental option offered at the end of Deuteronomy - the choice between life and death, the blessing and the curse. When Israel chooses life and follows the covenant, the blessings promised to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob follow. But when Israel chooses death and turns away from the covenant with God, destruction and doom follow.

The book of Joshua is named after the hero of Israel's period of conquest. Joshua succeeds Moses as leader of the Israelites and leads them in the struggle for possession of the land of Canaan. God says to Joshua, "As I was with Moses, I will be with you: I will not leave you nor forsake you" (Josh 1:5). Although the conquest of the land involves fighting battles, the narratives emphasize Israel's dependence on the LORD for their success. As fulfillment of promises made to their ancestors, the land is God's gift.

The crossing of the Jordan River into the Promised Land is presented as a liturgical procession. Just as Moses led God's people across the sea, Joshua leads the next generation across the river into the next stage of their life. The first conquest, the siege of Jericho, is also recounted as a liturgical event. The priests carry the ark of the covenant and blow ram's horns as they process around the walls of Jericho.

The purpose of this literary style is to demonstrate to every generation that God is faithful to the covenant in providing a homeland for the Israelites. Events that took place perhaps over many decades are condensed into a short period of time. The Deuteronomistic author does not offer military details but desires to demonstrate how all the events of seizing land happen according to the covenant.

After Joshua and his army conquer Jericho, they then go on to conquer Ai, Bethel, and Gibeon. A rapid sweep of southern Canaan is followed by the conquest of northern Canaan. After this victorious invasion, the author summarizes the work of Joshua: "Thus Joshua took the whole land, just as the LORD had said to Moses. Joshua gave it to Israel as their heritage, apportioning it among the tribes. And the land had rest from war." (Josh 11:23)

Following Joshua's victories and the division of the land among the tribes of Israel, in his final farewell to the people, Joshua proclaims all the great deeds God has done on behalf of Israel, from the call of Abraham to the conquest of the land. Then he urges the people to commit themselves to the service of the LORD.

GOT CATHOLIC QUESTIONS? OCIA HAS ANSWERS!

OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. In short, it is the process through which catechumens, who are unbaptized adults or older children, are formed in the teachings of the Catholicism and are initiated into the Catholic Church. This process may also include baptized adult Christians or Catholics who are preparing to receive the sacraments of confirmation and Eucharist. Baptized persons moving through OCIA are known as candidates.

Our parish Adult Faith Formation team has begun meeting with two candidates and will be working through a set of Inquiry lessons over the next few months according to the following schedule:

- March 30 Q5: The Bible; Q6: Divine Revelation
- April 6 Q7: Your Prayer Life, Q8: Catholic Prayers and Practices
- April 13 Q9: The Mass; C5: The Sacrament of the Eucharist
- April 27 Q10: The Church Year; Q11: Places in a Catholic Church
- May 4 Q12: Who Shepherds the Church?; Q13: The Church as Community
- May 18 Q14: Mary; Q15: The Saints
- June 8 Q16: Eschatology: the "Last Things"



We meet after Mass in the Fellowship Hall. Anyone is welcome to join. While the discussions use structured materials, we try to set a casual mood and welcome all questions, even those that may fall outside the scope of the prepared lesson.

LENT, TRIDUUM, AND EASTER



In a slight departure from previous practice, we will celebrate the Stations of the Cross with soup initially on Wednesdays and later in Lent on Fridays, as is traditional throughout the church.

The Triduum (Holy Thursday through the Easter Vigil) will be held at FdS this year.

The reconciliation service at COV is scheduled for April 9th @ 6pm, and FdS April 3rd @ 6:30pm.

On the admin table in the Narthex are the "Little Black Books" to assist you in your Lenten devotions. If you desire to participate in the Rice Bowl, the bowls are also on the Admin table.

Some other practices we should be aware of are: The Alleluia is not used until the Easter Vigil; the Altar should not be decorated with flowers except for the Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday); there are two solemnities during Lent, March 19th-Solemnity of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin and March 25th-Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.



All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting.

RESPECT FOR LIFE LAUNCHES
WALKING WITH MOMS IN NEED

This Tuesday, March 25th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. Mother Mary says, "Yes!" and the Word of God became flesh and made his dwelling in her who loved and lived that word.

March 25 also marks the 30th anniversary of Pope Saint John Paul the Great's papal letter, Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life). Our parish Respect for Life ministry, led by Helen Linden, selected this Tuesday to begin a project promoted by the US Catholic Bishops: Walking with Moms in Need.

Pregnant and parenting moms are in need in our parishes and our neighborhoods. As Pope Francis reminds us, our parishes need to be "islands of mercy in the midst of the sea of indifference." Everyone in the parish community should know where to refer a pregnant women in need. Inspired by Saint John Paul II's call to assess our efforts in building culture of life, the intention of Walking with Moms in Need is to increase our outreach to pregnant and parenting women facing difficulties.

Through a year long process, our parish will complete a simple inventory of the resources available in our local area, assess the results and identify gaps, and plan and implement a parish response based on our findings.

Working with other churches and community groups in our Middlesex and surrounding counties, we hope to move closer to the day when every pregnant woman in need knows where to turn for help, and abortion is simply unthinkable.
