This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study's "Panorama of the Old Testament".

The book of 1 Kings begins with the rise of King Solomon. The son of David and Bathsheba, Solomon is chosen by his elderly father over several of his older brothers. He consolidates David's kingdom during his long reign (forty years, 967 - 927 BC) and brings Israel to the most powerful and influential stage of its history,

Solomon is most recognized for his wisdom. After Solomon offers an elaborate sacrifice, God responds by appearing to him in a dream and offering whatever he wishes. Solomon answers by declaring himself inadequate for being kind and requests the gift that will best enable him to rule God's people well.

"Now, LORD, my God, you have made me your servant, king to succeed David my father; but I am a mere youth, not knowing at all how to act - I, your servant, among the people you have chosen, a people so vast that it cannot be numbered or counted. Give your servant, therefore, a listening heart to judge your people and to distinguish between good and evil. For who is able to give judgment for this vast people of yours?" (1 Kings 3:7-9)

God is pleased that Solomon asks for the gift of wisdom before all other gifts - before power, prestige, and possessions. Solomon recognizes himself to be a limited and fallible human creature, totally dependent on God. So God gives Solomon wisdom and exceptional understanding and knowledge. Later tradition associates the wisdom writings with Solomon - the Song of Songs, Ecclesiastes, Proverbs, and the book of Wisdom. Giving glory to the nation, Solomon establishes Israel as center of learning and the arts, as well as international trade. Under Solomon, Israel reaches the peak of its expanse, its wealth, and its fame among the nations.

King Solomon's most important accomplishment was the construction of the temple in Jerusalem (1 Kings 6-7) Although King David desired to honor God with a permanent dwelling, this work is carried out by his son. By building this magnificent house of worship, Solomon continues the concentration of Israel's faith traditions that David has begun in the city of Jerusalem.

Because of the temple, the Promised Land is now the Holy Land, and the city of Jerusalem is now the holy city. Now the whole people are able to dwell with God at this place where God has chosen to dwell. The temple and its worship express Israel's covenant relationship with God. It is the responsibility of the king to maintain the people in holiness. He must walk blamelessly before God, trusting in the LORD, observing the Torah, and honoring the covenant. Because in and through Israel, God has chosen to reveal himself to all the peoples of the earth.
