## LEGACY GIFTS

Permanent endowments are gifts that keep on giving. If the endowment agreement states that the principal shall never be invaded and that income is paid out to support a designated cause through your church, then your gift is "forever."

Trusts allow you to make a gift to your church in the future. You may set up the trust now and keep the income for yourself or other beneficiaries as long as you choose, or for life. The church will receive the property after that. There are special tax benefits for these kinds of trusts.

Charitable Remainder Trusts allow you to make a gift to your church while retaining income from the gifted asset during your lifetime (and that of your spouse). If the trust is funded with appreciated property, capital gains taxes may be avoided. There will also be a significant current income tax deduction at the time the trust is created.

Journey Through the Bible: The Kingdom Divided (1 Kings 12 - 2 Kings 17)

This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study’s “Panorama of the New Testament”.

During Solomon’s reign, civil unrest begins to surface, and at his death the fragile kingdom cracks. Rehoboam succeeds his father as king and refuses the demands of the northern tribes to ease taxation and forced labor. He provokes a revolt that will never heal. The northern tribes choose Jeroboam I as king and break away from Judah. The unity that David had established collapses and from then on the kingdom is divided. The northern ten tribes are thereafter called Israel and the southern kingdom is called Judah.

The political and religious consequences of the schism are enormous. The once-united kingdom is now divided against itself, each part regarding the other as an enemy. Both kingdoms are weaker and far more vulnerable to their enemies. The parallel histories of the northern and southern kingdoms until the destruction of Israel by Assyria are told in 1 Kings 12 through 2 Kings 17.

Jeroboam immediately begins to separate his people from worship in Jerusalem and he establishes religious shrines for sacrifice in Bethel and Dan. Here he sets up golden calves, repeating the sin of the Israelites at Sinai. The weakness caused by division and the idolatry at shrines of worship leads to the gradual decline of the northern kingdom toward disaster.

Assyria is the great empire of the period. After a succession of kings in Israel, Assyrian troops invade the northern kingdom and lay siege to its capital, Samaria, for three years. Israel falls to the armies of Assyria in 721 BC, marking the end of the northern kingdom. Many Israelites are deported to Assyria and people from five foreign populations are brought into the northern kingdom around the city of Samaria. The mixing and intermarriage of the Israelites and these foreigners has led later generations to call these people Samaritans. The Jewish people considered the Samaritans as unfaithful apostates and either ignored or despised them. In John’s gospel we will see Jesus accuse the Samaritan woman at Jacob’s well of having five husbands, an allusion to the five nations who compromised the covenant faith of the people with their own gods and religious practices.

The conquered northern kingdom wonders if God has abandoned the covenant promises to Abraham, Moses, and David. How could God have allowed them to be taken from the land? The narrator makes clear that the people were conquered because the Israelites sinned against the LORD. They venerated other gods and followed the religious practices of other peoples, serving idols and even offering their children in sacrifice.

“The LORD warned Israel and Judah...Give up your evil ways and keep my commandments...But they did not listen. They grew stiff necked...They rejected his statutes...They followed emptiness and became empty; they followed the surrounding nations whom the LORD commanded them not to imitate.” (2 Kings 17:13-15)

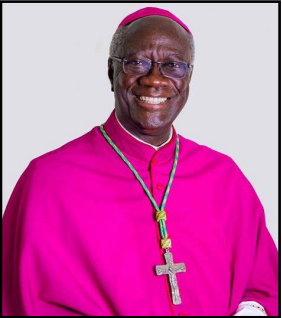
BISHOP’S VISIT

At the end of June, we will observe a special event for our parish and Father Koo.

Arch Bishop John Bonaventure Kwofie from Accra, Ghana will visit the Diocese from June 25th-30th, staying at the Rectory and helping us celebrate Father Koo’s 30th year of Ordination.

On Sunday, June 29th, and in a slight departure from our normal Sunday schedule, we will celebrate a **10:00AM** Mass here at COV jointly with FdS, followed by lunch in the Fellowship Hall.

Father Koo was ordained on July 22, 1995, and we welcome the opportunity to honor him and host the visit of a distinguished guest along with parishioners from our sister church.



TODAY IS THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

The most Holy Trinity is the central and most profound mystery of the Christian faith and life. While we human beings can grasp certain aspects of this ultimate truth about God, precisely as a mystery, a full understanding is beyond our limited human comprehension. Yet, this deep mystery of God’s inner life and essence is also one of the most informative on that, reflecting on the Trinity can shed invaluable light on what it means to be a human person.

Throughout history and in cultures throughout the world people have, by reason alone and after much consideration, concluded that God exists. Yet, we would devote ourselves to study over several lifetimes and never come to the conclusion that God is a Trinity of person-one and yet three: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We know this truth and other divine mysteries in our human weakness only because the Lord has revealed them to us. And he has revealed this truth not as a matter of curious theological trivia disconnected from our everyday lives, but in order to share his divine life with us.

The mystery of the Blessed Trinity, as the mystery of God in himself, is “the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the ‘hierarchy of the truths of faith” (CCC 235).

Since the earliest days-before the Church was born at Pentecost-the Christian faith has been Trinitarian. When Jesus descended into the water at his baptism, for example, the bystanders hear the Father’s voice and see the Holy Spirit descend as a dove (Matthew 3:16-17) Later, Jesus will instruct his followers to “make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” (Matthew 28:19). Likewise, Saint Paul offered blessings with a Trinitarian formula (2 Corinthians 13:13) and the blessings and prayers of the early Church reflect this faith in the Trinity.

The essential elements of this divine mystery are that we worship one God who is an eternal loving communion of three Persons-Father, Son and Holy Spirit-who are all equal in power, all co-eternal, and all divine. One divine nature, they differ only in that the Father is not the Son; the Son is not the Father; the Spirit is not the Son; the Spirit is not the Father. While this mystery of one and yet three might at first seem contradictory and irrational by human reckoning, if we delve deeper, we will find, like the other paradoxes of the faith, an amazing and profoundly life-changing truth.
