LEGACY GIFTS

Permanent endowments are gifts that keep on giving. If the endowment agreement states that the principal shall never be invaded and that income is paid out to support a designated cause through your church, then your gift is "forever."



Trusts allow you to make a gift to your church in the future. You may set up the trust now and keep the income for yourself or other beneficiaries as long as you choose, or for life. The church will receive the property after that. There are special tax benefits for these kinds of trusts.

Charitable Remainder Trusts allow you to make a gift to your church while retaining income from the gifted asset during your lifetime (and that of your spouse). If the trust is funded with appreciated property, capital gains taxes may be avoided. There will also be a significant current income tax deduction at the time the trust is created.

Journey Through the Bible: The Fall of Judah (2 Kings 12-25)

This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study's "Panorama of the Old Testament".

The final chapters of 2 Kings tell of the last kings of Judah, the southern kingdom. Judah maintains the succession of kings in the dynasty of David. In relating the lives of each king, the Deuteronomic writer focuses on their fidelity (or infidelity) to the LORD. Unfortunately their general tendency is to follow the terrible example of the north. Most of the kings rule unfaithfully, failing to keep the covenant, thus contributing to the kingdom's decline.

However, two kings of Judah stand out as faithful. King Hezekiah, reigning from 715 to 687 BC, revolts against Assyria and initiates religious reform. Although Assyria attacks and pillages much of Judah, Jerusalem is miraculously spared and Hezekiah retains his throne. The other faithful king is Josiah, reigning from 640 to 609 BC. He bases his religious reform movement on the book of the covenant, discovered in the temple during his reign. He repudiates the Assyrian gods and centralizes the worship of God in Jerusalem. Leading the people of Judah in public repentance, he renews God's covenant with them.

Josiah pleases God through his actions, but it seems to be too little too late. The people's tendency toward apostasy continues into the next generations. The fall of Assyria during Josiah's reign opens the way for the rise of Babylon. Then, after several more unfaithful kings, Babylon invades the southern kingdom. During the reign of King Zedekiah, the armies of Babylon set fire to the temple and the king's palace. In 587 BC Jerusalem is destroyed and all the religious institutions of God's people are in ruin. The great nation established by David and Solomon has died. Many are killed; others flee and go down to Egypt and other places. The king and the leading citizens are all taken into captivity in Babylon.

The deportation to Babylon seems like the end. Jerusalem and its temple are destroyed. Where is God while Babylon triumphs over the people of God? What has come of God's assurances that David's lineage will continue forever? What has happened to God's promises to redeem the nations of the world through the descendants of Abraham?

The seeming end of Israel as a nation does not mark the end of God or of God's promises. Although the Israelites are crushed and defeated, God is still the LORD and the divine purposes endure. Although God has graciously lived in the land with his people, God is not confined to the land.

The double book of Kings ends with a glimpse of hope. The new king of Babylon frees King Jehoiachin of Judah from prison and invites him to eat regularly at his royal table. Perhaps the story of Israel and the lineage of David has in fact not ended.

VIRTUS AND BACKGROUND SCREENING

As we approach a new fiscal year in the Diocese, it is normal for many offices to revise procedures and processes. In a major change, starting July I, the Office of Safe Environment will require the following individuals/ groups to attend a Virtus Class and complete a background check:

- All individuals possessing a key to the Church
- Ushers
- Pastoral Care ministers
- Faith Formation instructors and personnel.

Having attended a Virtus class in the past, irrespective of date, exempts a person from that requirement. Our plan is to schedule a Virtus class locally in the Fall. However, if you want to attend online or at another location, the class schedule is available at virtusonline.org. This website also contains the application form for a background check

Accordingly, if you are an individual in the above categories, go online and initiate a background check. If you haven't attended a Virtus Class, either sign up for a class or wait for our announcement of a class locally and register for it. 
